# Program Purpose


The Phoenix Indian Center's

Program is a year-long program
that empowers American Indian
(AI) youths to plan for life after high
school.

The program incorporates
Indigenous culture, decision-making
skills, academic goal preparation,
career exploration, and career
training initiatives, to help Al youths
graduate high school and become
successful in their life's journey.



# Program Membership

- Open to self-identifying American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian high school students. No CIB required.
- Must reside within Maricopa County, Coconino County, or the Salt-River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community.
- No minimum GPA is required.
- Rolling Admission, throughout the grant cycle year, via a program application.



# **Program Overview**

Our program incorporates culture, decision making, and goal setting skills to help American Indian students graduate high school and prepare for adulthood.

- **COLLEGE PREPARATION**: Learn skills to help you succeed through high school, prepare for higher education, locate and apply for financial aid, and to apply to college or trade school.
- CAREER READINESS: Explore your passions through employer visits.
   Develop skills needed to build strong networks.
- **CULTURE:** Discover how your culture impacts you and your community through traditional and cultural activities & events.
- WELLNESS & PREVENTION: Learn how to overcome peer pressure and avoid risky behaviors.

# Youth Activities

Youth participants have opportunities to participate in cultural and community-based events through our programming year.

The Youth Council is the representative youth voice of the Phoenix Indian Center and the American Indian Urban Community. The Youth Council is comprised of up to 25 high school members (grades 9-12), representing multiple area high schools and various tribes within Maricopa County.

## Youth Council Committees

Interns gain experience working with professional employers. They can work up to 40 hours a week, for three weeks each Summer.

- Mentorship with business leaders in their field of interest.
