Eligibility Process





Requirements of Arizona McKinney-Vento Liaisons

According to Arizona's ESSA State Plan, McKinney-Vento Liaisons must:

- Complete the McKinney-Vento Liaison Contact Form found on the ADE Homeless Education Program website;
- Collaborate with school personnel to ensure use of the Student Residency Questionnaire and Unaccompanied Youth Caregiver's Authorization Form to identify homeless students;
- Utilize the Best Interest Determination (BID) Form to make school enrollment decisions, when necessary,
- Assess the needs presented by the students through locally developed informal needs assessment tools;
- Ensure required student data elements for homeless students and youth are accurately submitted to ADE;
- Provide at minimum an annual training to all LEA school staff including administrative staff; and
- Annually develop, review, and revise policies to increase access to educational opportunities and academic success.

Federal Legal Requirement



The McKinney-Vento Act requires data to be collected and provided to the federal government and for the Secretary of Education to disseminate that information to stakeholders. Additionally, state educational agencies (SEAs) must include counts of homeless students on their agency websites.

> [42 U.S.C. § 11432(f)(1), 42 U.S.C. § 11432 (f)(3)], [42 U.S.C. § 11434(h)(1)], [42 U.S.C. § 11432(f)(1)(A)]



SEAs must consider the quality of a subgrant application, the appropriateness of proposed activities **based on identified student needs**, and past success in meeting student needs before making awards.

[42 U.S.C. § 11433(c)(3), 2 C.F.R. Section 200.205]



Local educational agencies (LEAs) that compete for subgrant funds must provide needs assessments and **demonstrate a need** for funds as part of their subgrant applications. Likewise, state educational agencies (SEAs) may consider the **number of homeless** students enrolled in the LEA prior to making subgrant awards.



Student Information System (SIS) Data Important Reminders



Students in Foster Care

Students in the **foster care system are no longer counted in HCY enrollment data**, as per the reauthorization of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) in December 2015.



Preschool-Aged HCY Children

Identified HCY between the ages of 3-5 years **are included** in your LEA's/Charter District's total enrolled HCY, **only if they are enrolled in a preschool program provided by the LEA/Charter District**.

Children ages 0-2, or 3-5, and **not enrolled in a preschool program at your LEA/Charter District, are not included** in the total enrolled HCY count.



HCY & UHY Students

Identified **HCY students are** required to have their needs identifiers and corresponding primary nighttime residence entered in the student information system (SIS).

Identified UHY must be coded with both the HCY and UHY needs identifiers and corresponding primary nighttime residence in the SIS.



If a HCY/UHY Student Leaves the LEA/Charter District

Once a student is identified/enrolled at your LEA, they should remain in the total enrolled HCY count for that school year in the SIS, even if they move transfer to another LEA/Charter District.

Often, LEAs/Charter Districts label these students as "inactive" since they are no longer enrolled. However, **they must still be counted in the reported number of enrolled HCY/UHY for the school year.**



AzEDS SUPP11 Report

Your LEA's/Charter District's HCY and UHY needs **data** can be **validated** using the AzEDS SUPP11 report.





As of now, the number of HCY and UHY reported by many LEA/Charter Districts via the AzEDS SUPP11 report for the current SY **seems lower than expected, based on multiple longitudinal data points**.



Eligibility & Legal Requirements

Eligibility Process





The local educational agency serving each child or youth to be assisted under this part shall, according to the child's or youth's best interest— (i) **continue** the child's or youth's education in the school of origin for the duration of homelessness—

[42 U.S.C. § 11432(g)(3)], § 11432(g)(3)(A)(i)]



The local educational agency serving each child or youth to be assisted under this part shall, according to the child's or youth's best interest— (i) **continue** the child's or youth's **education** in the **school of origin** for the **duration** of

homelessness-

(I) in any case in which a family becomes homeless **between academic years** or during an academic year; and


(II) for the **remainder** of the **academic year**, if the child or youth becomes permanently housed during an academic year;

[42 U.S.C. § 11432(g)(3)], § 11432(g)(3)(A)]




The law also states, "When the child or youth completes the final grade level served by the school of origin, the term 'school of origin' shall include the **designated receiving school** at the **next grade** level for all **feeder** schools".

([42 U.S.C. § 11432(g)(3)(I)(ii)])



Eligibility Process





The McKinney-Vento Act requires the SEA State Plan shall include strategies to address other problems with respect to the education of homeless children and youth, including problems resulting from enrollment delays.

[42 U.S.C. § 11432(g)(1)(H)

Important Reminder



End of Year Written Notification

The written notification **provides** families with **necessary information** pertaining to the **student's rights**.

It's also a **best practice** for the McKinney-Vento Liaison to aid in:

- Planning for the **re-evaluation** process
- Planning for **upcoming school year**
- Coordination of transportation ahead of time

Best Practice (Sample Letter)

Homeless Education

ADE End of Year Notification Letter Sample

May 20___

Dear Parent/Guardian/Caregiver,

Our records indicate that at some point this school year your child(ren) qualified for services under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Act. It has been our pleasure to provide educational support services during this time and we hope it has been a positive experience for you as well.

Please be reminded that McKinney-Vento eligibility <u>must be reviewed and reevaluated every</u> <u>school year</u>. Transportation, free meals, and other services that may have been provided during the current school year DO NOT AUTOMATICALLY CARRY OVER to the new school year.

Next school year you will need to:

- Consider enrollment at the local school of residence where other students in your neighborhood are assigned to attend.
- Apply for open enrollment. Please note that open enrollment is a site based decision and the McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison does not have any jurisdiction over the decision. Also be aware that district transportation is <u>NOT</u> provided for open enrollment students.
- If you feel you are still in a homeless situation, you may request review of eligibility. We have
 included the Student Residency Questionnaire for next school year. Please contact the
 McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison after July 1st for review and reevaluation if necessary.

Best Practice



Delivery Options

- Text
- •Email
- •Website post
- Social media post
- •Delivery home with the student
- •Front office staff may see parents more often than the Liaison. They can provide a gently reminder.



Eligibility Process



LEA Legal Requirement



LEAs in the State are required to develop, review and revise policies to remove barriers to the identification of homeless children and youth, and the enrollment and retention due to outstanding fees, or fines, or absences.

[42 U.S.C. § 11432(g)(1)(I)

Important Reminder



Reevaluation is Required

- •You **cannot assume** that all families are no longer eligible.
- Updating important contact information and the address is necessary especially for transportation routing purposes.
- •This may be an opportune time to **conduct** a **BID** if necessary.
- Prioritize your follow up calls

Best Practice



Reevaluation Conversations

Make sure that your approach is informative, intentional, and caring. Intentionality in gathering pertinent information will be important. Details such as:

- Updated address
- Shelter wait list update
- Parent input regarding enrollment wishes
- Educational support updates such as Special Education evaluations.

Best Practice



Step 1: Compile a list of all McKinney-Vento eligible students.

☑ Doubled Up
 ☑ Shelter (including transitional housing)
 ☑ Unaccompanied Homeless Youth

☑ Hotel-Motel
 ☑ Unsheltered

Step 2: Prioritize the list.

1st Shelter Placements 3rd Unsheltered

2nd UHY 4th Hotel-Motel

5th Doubled Up

Step 3: Begin the follow up process

Step 4: Take thorough notes, place in the students McKinney-Vento file.

Tying It Together

- Take detailed and accurate notes
- •Use a filing system to keep the information.
- •Consider building a Homeless tab within your SIS where your case notes can be kept.
- •Share pertinent information with school personnel, as necessary.

•If you are not working through the summer months, make sure there is a well laid out plan before you leave.
