OIE RISE Introduction

History

- A.R.S. 15-244. Office of Indian education; definition
- 5-million-dollar allocation from State legislature in 2022

Purpose

- Support educational needs and opportunities in Arizona districts and schools that serve a significant number of Native American students and staff, consistent with the purposes of the Office of Indian Education legislation A.R.S. 15-244.
 - Supplemental resources
 - Authentic stakeholder and community engagement
 - Strategic partnerships
 - Initiatives that promote academically excellent and culturally relevant educational opportunities



OIE RISE Grant Goals

- 1) Students and staff benefit from programs and opportunities that focus on academic preparation for college, career, and community leadership, for identity development, and for holistic well-being.
- 2) Funded projects act as "bright spots" for future investment by the ADE Office of Indian Education to expand and/or replicate successful programs based on community needs and desires in Indigenous Education.



OIE RISE Grant Goals

Proposed programs under this grant will inspire and empower local systems to dramatically improve and transform education and life outcomes for Native American students.

The intent of this program is for innovation and flexibility combined with techincal assistance to meet community priorities for education and respond to the changing educational landscape and identified needs of Native American students in Arizona.



Funded Strategies and Programs

Funded programs will participate in a three-year process that includes community engagement, professional development, and technical assistance, wit the end goal to build community strengths and meet community needs for Indigenous Education as follows:

- Year 1: Stakeholders and community engagement, plan development
- Year 2: Implementation plan
- Year 3: Continued plan implementation while building sustainable practices and programs



Important Dates for the FY24 OIE RISE Grant



Eligibility Criteria

- School districts in Arizona consisting of public and/or charter schools serving Native American students and educators.
- Consortiums consisting of tribally-controlled and/or grant school serving Native American students and educators.

Note: District applicants must designate the specific school site(s) that will be OIE RISE project sites. To have a concentrated impact, Districts are encouraged to **limit** the number of schools participating to **one to two schools**. Only one application is permitted per District/Consortium.



Consortia Requirements

- Must consist of tribally-controlled and/or grant schools serving native American students and educators in Arizona
- Establish a fiscal agent to:
 - Submit a single FY24 RISE grant application on behalf of the consortium
 - Ensure compliance of the consortium members
 - Establish and upload the consortium's Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)
 - Ensure proposed budget is aligned and sites are accounted for
 - Upload signed Assurances and Certifications for each LEA consortium member



Funding Allocation

For fiscal year 2024, the ADE Office of Indian Education intends to award a minimum of eight multi-year grants in amounts not to exceed \$225,000 each. Applicants shall propose a project period of three years.

The above amount will be funded in the following increments:

- Year 1 100% with a **maximum** amount of \$100,000
- Year 2 75% with a maximum amount of \$75,000 (25% grantee matching funds)
- Year 3 50% with a maximum amount of \$50,000 (50% grantee matching funds)



Approximating Award Amounts

Award amount depends on 3 factors:

- 1. Size of LEA
- 2. Percentage of American Indian / Alaska Native Student Enrollment
- 3. Proximity to Tribal Lands

Approximate Award Range: *##### -* \$100,000



Grant Application Open Date	• March 1, 2023
Grant Application Close Date	• May 1, 2023
Project Availability for FY24	• July 1, 2023 – September 30, 2024
Grant Cycle Availability	• July 1, 2023 – September 30, 2027

Considerations

OIE RISE FY24 Funds	•	Project availability ends September 30, 2024
OIE RISE Funds	•	 3-year grant cycle Begins July 1, 2023 Concludes September 30, 2027
