Overview of the Direct Certification with Medicaid Data Demonstration Project

DC with Medicaid Data Demonstration Project

ADE has been approved to administer the Arizona Direct Certification Medicaid (DC-M) Free and Reduced Demonstration Project starting in School Year 2023-2024.

DC-M is the use of Medicaid data files to identify children eligible to receive meals through the NSLP and SBP for free or reduced-price without the need of an application.

Subject: Announcement of the Direct Certification with Medicaid Data Demonstration Project

The purpose of this memorandum is to announce Arizona's participation in the Direct Certification with Medicaid Data Demonstration (DC-M) Project. The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) has approved the Arizona Department of Education (ADE) to partner with the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) to administer the Arizona DC-M. The DC-M demonstration project is for both free and reduced-price meal eligibility in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and School Breakfast Program (SBP) and will begin in Arizona in School Year 2023-2024.

Eligibility Requirements

DC-M is the use of Medicaid data files to identify children eligible to receive meals through the NSLP and SBP for free or reduced-price without the need of application. Medicaid is the medical assistance program established under Title XIX of the Social Security Act. To be eligible for Medicaid data matching, students must receive Medicaid or live in a household with another child who receives Medicaid and has family income as measured by the Medicaid Program. Information from Medicaid data files will be used to identify students eligible to receive meals for free or at a reduced price. The Medicaid data matching process will allow School Food Authorities (SFAs) to certify eligible students for meal benefits without the need of a household application.

NSLP income eligibility standards will be used to determine a student's benefit level for school meals:

- 130% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) for free meal eligibility
- 185% of the FPL for reduced-price meal eligibility

Matching Medicaid Data in CNP Direct Certification/ Direct Verification

Technology enhancements are being developed for the *CNP Direct Certification/ Direct Verification* system in *ADEConnect*, including Medicaid data to match individual students for benefits. Once the enhancements are complete and tested, the system will yield match results for Medicaid for free

DC-M Eligibility

STUDENT ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for Medicaid data matching, students must either receive Medicaid or live in a household with another child who receives Medicaid and has family income as measured by the Medicaid Program.

Hierarchy of DC Matches

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF), Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), and other direct certification matches **always** supersede Medicaid matches for reporting purposes.

Students should be identified as a Medicaid match only when there is no match with SNAP, TANF, FDPIR, or other programs.



Preparing for DC-M

SFA RESPONSIBILITIES

SFAs must notify their respective vendor/Point of Sale software provider of the inclusion DC-M free and DC-M reduced data for the upcoming school year.

Vendors will need to prepare the user interface and system to intake the two new direct certification fields (DC-M Free and DC-M Reduced) and ensure hierarchy rules outlined on the prior slide are implemented when a child matches in multiple categories of direct certification.

CNP Direct Certification

ACCESSING THE SYSTEM

Direct Certification using Medicaid Data is conducted in the CNP Direct Certification (CNPDC) web-based application in ADEConnect.

To access the CNPDC system, login to ADEConnect, select "View Applications," and then select "CNP Direct Certification / Direct Verification."

 If CNP Direct Certification / Direct Verification is not a listed application in ADEConnect, you will need to request access from your Entity Administrator.

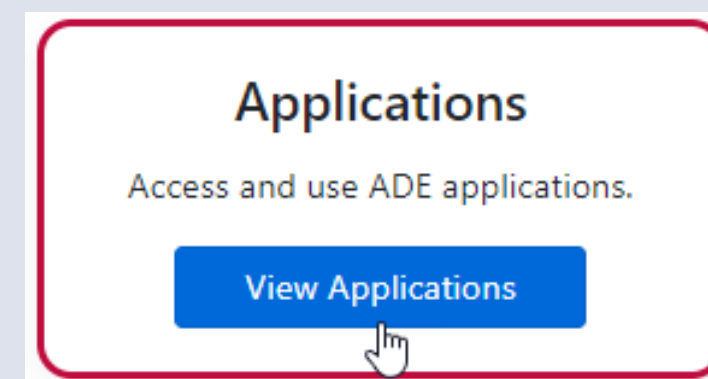
LOGIN TO ADECONNECT

Open a web browser, navigate to adeconnect.azed.gov, and input your username and password for ADEConnect.

SELECT "VIEW APPLICATIONS"

After logging in to ADEConnect, select "View Applications."

SELECT "CNP DIRECT CERTIFICATION / DIRECT VERIFICATION"

Select "CNP Direct Certification / Direct Verification" from the list of applications in ADEConnect.

ACCESSING THE SYSTEM

After successfully logging in to the CNP Direct Certification / Direct Verification System, a screen with a Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) statement will load. The statement must be read, understood, and acknowledged to advance in the system by selecting "I AGREE/CONTINUE."

After the FERPA statement has been acknowledged, you will then be brought to a new screen where you must select CNP Direct Certification by clicking "Proceed to Direct Certification."

Direct Certification

Direct Certification means determining which children are eligible for free meal benefits based on documentation obtained directly from the appropriate State or local agency.

All Child Nutrition Program School Food Authorities (SFAs)* are required to run a Direct Certification report at least three times per school year using CNP Direct Certification:

- At or around the beginning of the school year (July 1)
- three months after the initial effort, and
- six months after the initial effort

No application is necessary if eligibility is determined through the direct certification process.

If a household submits an application for children who were directly certified, direct certification takes precedence over an application.

Direct Verification

Available October 1st

Conducting Direct Verification is a requirement in the state of Arizona. Direct Verification is not Direct Certification; however, they're located in the same application via the ADE Common Logon, CNP Direct Certification/Direct Verification. Direct Verification can only be conducted during the Verification time frame (Oct. 1- Nov. 15) and must only be conducted for applications that are part of the Verification sample. Since Verification for Cause can be conducted at any time during the year, including dates that Direct Verification is not available, ADE does not require LEAs to conduct Direct Verification for applications selected to be verified for cause.

To accommodate DC using Medicaid data, the CNPDC system received the following updates:

1. Addition of Medicaid (MA)-Free and MA-Reduced Categories and Counts.
2. Addition of MA-Free and MA-Reduced in the Eligibility Type Column and Data Extraction.

Identifying DC-M Matches

DC-M & THE CNPDC SYSTEM

To identify students qualifying for free and reduced-price meals using Medicaid data, SFAs will conduct DC using standard processes.

The CNPDC system results will reflect student matches in accordance with the hierarchy of DC matches.

Medicaid data matches will be categorized as MA-Free or MA-Reduced under the Eligibility Type column.

NOTIFYING DC-M MATCHES

After conducting DC, students qualifying for free or reduced-price meals must be notified indicating the DC source in which they were matched.

If you believe your child(ren) qualify for free meals – complete and return a Free/Reduced application to the school with income information or a current SNAP (Food Stamp)/TANF case number.

- You have any additional questions.

**NOTIFICATION LETTER FOR FREE SCHOOL MEALS
DIRECT CERTIFICATION**

Dear Parent/Guardian:

We want to let you know that the child(ren) listed below qualify for free school meals because they receive [State SNAP] [FDPIR] [State TANF] [Foster] [Homeless] [Migrant] or [Medicaid-Free] benefits. This means that you do not need to fill out a household application for these children to determine eligibility for free or reduced-price meals.

If someone in your household receives State SNAP, FDPIR, State TANF, or Medicaid-Free and there are other children in your household who aren't listed above, *they also qualify for free meals.* Please note that Foster, Homeless, or Migrant students do not extend free meal benefits to other children in their household.

- If there are other children in your household who are not listed above, and you would like them to be qualified for free meals.
- You do not want your children to qualify for free meals.
- You have any additional questions.

Template Notification Letters for Students Qualifying for Free or Reduced Meals through DC-M



Households directly certified for reduced-price meals must be notified of the income level used and offered the opportunity to apply via a household application if they think their income is within the standard for free meals.
