

15-244.01. <u>Tribal college dual enrollment program</u> <u>fund; intergovernmental agreements</u>

A. The tribal college dual enrollment program fund is established consisting of monies deposited pursuant to section 5-568, other monies appropriated by the legislature and gifts, grants, devises and other contributions of monies or property from any lawful public or private source. The department of education shall administer the fund. The department shall distribute monies in the fund to **provide** choice and access to higher education for high school students in this state by compensating tribal colleges for books and instructional materials and for tuition and fees that are waived to allow high school students to attend classes at tribal college campuses. . . .




Benefits

The Tribal College Dual Enrollment Program provides Arizona's high school students the opportunity to take college courses for both high school and college credit. Course costs are free to the student. Participating tribal colleges are reimbursed for tuition and fees associated with participating students. Effective September 24, 2022, the Arizona state legislature passed SB1300 allowing the Arizona Department of Education to reimburse the cost of books and instructional materials as well.
