² Because the Standard Professional Mild/Moderate Disabilities certificate only requires a professional knowledge exam, applicants who are enrolled in an Arizona Board-approved mild/moderate disabilities program are not required to pass a subject knowledge exam.

³ Program must also have an approved supervision plan for student teachers.
