Menu Planning

Quantities observed during the review period did not meet minimum amounts required by the meal pattern. Specifically, weekly starchy vegetable quantities were insufficient; 1/4 cup starchy vegetable was documented as served when 1/2 cup starchy vegetable is required weekly. This was not a repeat finding from cycle two and therefore did not contribute towards fiscal action calculations.
