PROGRAM MANAGEMENT

The Exceptional Student Services (ESS) Program Management team distributes Individuals with Disabilities Education Act grant monies to eligible Public Education Agencies (PEA) throughout Arizona. The grant application process is facilitated through the Grants Management Enterprise (GME) system. Grants are approved, amended, and financially monitored through this system. The program management team and the program support and monitoring specialist in ESS facilitate programmatic monitoring for IDEA grants.

- State and local funds (M&O funds that are used to calculate Maintenance of Effort)
- 2. IDEA Preschool carryover
- 3. IDEA Basic carryover
- 4. IDEA Section 619 current year allocation
- 5. IDEA Section 611 current year allocation
- 6. ESS Claims (High-Cost Child or Extraordinary Special Education Needs)



LIFE CYCLE OF IDEA PART B GRANTS

February 2023 – Preliminary Awards for FY24 IDEA grants posted on ESS PM website

March 1, 2023 – FY24 IDEA Part B funding applications open

May 1, 2023 – FY24 IDEA funding applications due

July 1, 2023 – FY24 project period begins

November 1, 2023 – FY24 Full Awards deposited into GME

February 1, 2024 – FY24 Final Adjustment for new/expanding charter schools

June 30, 2024 – Fiscal year end

September 30, 2024 – Project period ends

December 30, 2024 – Completion report fully approved by ADE Grants Management

WHAT'S UP NEXT FOR IDEA GRANTS?

9/30/23: Project Period End Date

All grants must be in SEA Director Approved status before the Completion Report (CR) can be drafted

10/15/23: LEA Annual Financial Report

MOE Compliance will be tested from values on pages 2 and 7 for Charters, 2 and 8 for Districts

November 2023: Fall Allocation Adjustment

Full award will be posted to the 2024 IDEA Allocations Workbook

12/29/23: CRs must be approved by Grants Management

ESS recommends submitting by 10/31/23 to guarantee enough time for all levels of approval (County Business Manager, ESS, and Grants Management)

New GEPA Requirement in FY24 Applications as of July 1, 2023 (7/3/2023)



As of July 1, 2023 all federal grant funding applications in the GME system will include a section to which will satisfy the requirements of Section 427 of the General Provisions Act (GEPA) (20 U.S.C. 1228a).

Section 427 requires each applicant for funds to include in its application a description of the steps the applicant proposes to take to remove barriers and to ensure equitable access to, and participation in, its Federally-assisted program for students, teachers, and other program beneficiaries.

What you need to know for FY24:

- The GEPA page will <u>only</u> be visible once the application is in Revision status
- The page will be found in the section titled General Education Provisions Act (GEPA).
 - o Will not impact original applications
 - Required with first revision
 - A validation error will prevent application status from being changed to CR Draft started if the GEPA page is not completed.
 There is **not** a minimum word count for a GEPA statement

What you need to know for FY25:

The GEPA page will be part of the Original application and will be required on initial funding application submission

PEAs must respond to the GEPA form on the first revision of IDEA Part B.

NEXT STEPS FOR FY24 IDEA PART B FUNDING APPLICATIONS

- Review budget narratives for TBD statements for Educator IDs and placeholders for indirect cost rates
- Complete GEPA forms for 611 or 619 grants upon first revision
- Submit reimbursement requests for the first quarter

The FY2024 MOE Eligibility Testing window will be open from July 18 - August 18, 2023. PEAs that have met the eligibility standard will be closed by the ESS Program Management team to allow processing of the FY2024 IDEA Part B Consolidated Grants.

The MOE Eligibility testing data reflects the State & Local funds reported on your 2024 Adopted Budget and the estimated SPED count from the SPED20 report from AzEDS. These values are compared against the MOE Compliance standards established in the FV23 MOE Compliance test in March 2023. To pass the MOE Eligibility test, only one of the four available methodologies must meet or exceed your comparison year's compliance value, also known as the compliance standard.

If your PEA has failed the MOE Eligibility test, please review your test results by clicking on LEA Activities -->Eligibility. Then, choose No for Local Only funds and confirm your choice.

PEAs that have failed both method 2 and method 4 may resolve the MOE Eligibility case by:

- Submitting allowable exceptions through the MOE Application, or
- Submitting a revised budget through the ADE Budget
