

### Legislative Update 56th First Regular Session

- ADE introduced three bills this session
  - SB 1657 graduation; statewide assessment; requirements (Held)
  - SB 1385 student discipline profiles; school achievement (Held)
  - HB 2599 interstate compact; military children; revisions (Passed and Signed by Governor Hobbs)



### Notable K-12 Bills Signed Into Law

- ➤ SB 1720 General appropriations act, 2023-2024
  - ➤ K-12 Transportation Formula Study
  - Tribal College Dual Enrollment (on going)
- > SB 1729 K-12 education, 2023-2024
  - Dual Enrollment Student & Teacher Incentives
  - Live Remote Instruction
  - Early Education and Career Exploration Program
  - Professional Development and Support Personnel Pilot Program
- ➤ HB 2060 Schools; requirements; revisions
  - Contains a KEA provision.
    - Allows, rather than requires, SBE to adopt a kindergarten entry evaluation tool and declares school districts and charter schools are not required to administer this tool.

#### Notable K-12 Bills Signed Into Law Cont....

- ➤ HB 2460 Suspension; requirements; K-4 students
  - ➤ Provides that the statutory criteria required for the suspension or expulsion of a pupil in kindergarten, or the 1st-4th grades do not apply if the suspension does not exceed two days and the aggregate suspensions for the pupil do not exceed 10 days within a school year.
- ➤ HCR 2001 school district expenditures; authorization
  - ➤ Transmitted to SOS
- >SCR 1041 school districts; expenditure limit; authorization
  - ➤ Transmitted to SOS

## 56th First Regular Session Headlines!

- ➤ Longest session in Arizona history with 204 session days. (previous record was 173 days in 1988)
- Record number of vetoes 143.
- Bipartisan budget passed both chambers by mid May.
  - > \$18 billion budget.
- Prop 400 passed to end the legislative session on July 31st.
- ➤ Member resignations/expulsions
  - Senator Kaiser (LD 2) replaced by Shawnna Bolick
  - > Senator Teran (LD 26) replaced by Flavio Bravo
  - ➤ Rep. Harris (LD 13) replaced by Julie Willoughby
  - ➤ Rep. Cano (LD 20) replaced by Betty Villegas
  - > Rep. Bravo (LD 26) replaced by Quanta Crews



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
