

## LEA Homeless Education Program Guidance Documents and Forms List (For Compliance)

Under the McKinney-Vento Act, every local educational agency (LEA) is required to designate a liaison for homeless children and youth. The LEA's liaison coordinates services to ensure that homeless children and youths enroll in school and have the opportunity to succeed academically. Under the law, the liaison must be able to carry out the duties included in the law. Therefore, the LEA must provide the liaison with sufficient time and capacity to carry out the required set of duties to ensure that the LEA is in compliance with the law. The Local Educational Agency Liaison Duties document describes those duties and serves as a tool for liaisons to assess their capacity to carry out these duties. 42 US Code § 11432 (g)(7)(A)

The LEA McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison is required to develop, review, revise policies and procedures to remove barriers to the identification, enrollment, and retention of students experiencing homelessness (42 U.S.C. § 11432(g)(1)(I)), ESSA Arizona State Plan (K)(1); (K)(6)).

To assist with this requirement, the Office of Homeless Education works collaboratively with LEAs to help develop locally driven policies and procedures to support children and youth experiencing homelessness to ensure they face no barriers. The following list of required documents was compiled to help assist you as you endeavor to establish procedures for your LEA.

In developing this guidance, the ADE Homeless Education Program referenced McKinney-Vento statute, and consulted with the National Center for Homeless Education (NCHE) and SchoolHouse Connection. By referencing these resources and partners, we aim to provide you with comprehensive and relevant resources.

| Dispute<br>Resolution<br>Procedure &<br>Form                        | LEAs/Charter Districts are required to adopt a written dispute resolution policy that describes procedures for resolving disputes at the local level. If a dispute arises over eligibility, school selection, or enrollment and related services, the LEA must immediately enroll, transport, and provide all services to children and youth experiencing homelessness in the school in which enrollment is sought pending final resolution of the dispute, including all available appeals. | Identification &<br>Immediate<br>Enrollment                                    | The LEA has an ongoing obligation to remove barriers to the immediate enrollment and retention of HCY. A procedure should be in place to ensure the removal of barriers to enrollment, as may occur in the absence of records normally required for enrollment, missed application or enrollment deadlines during a period of homelessness, outstanding fees, or obtaining or sharing records due to movement to or from another school or district. | Student<br>Residency<br>Questionnaire  | LEAs/Charter Districts / Charter Districts are required to establish a coordinated referral process to determine eligibility consistently to coordinate or expedite referrals for services and coordinate services overall for families or youths to improve education and other outcomes for homeless children and youths. | Caregiver's<br>Authorization<br>Affidavit | LEAs/Charter Districts / Charter Districts are required to establish a coordinated referral process to determine eligibility consistently to coordinate or expedite referrals for services and coordinate services overall for families or youths to improve education and other outcomes for homeless children and youths. There are situations when a child or youth who is homeless may not be able to reside with their parent or guardian; however, this fact does not nullify the child's or youth's right to receive a free, appropriate public education. In this situation, the child may be considered an unaccompanied youth. The term unaccompanied youth includes a youth not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian. 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| Best Interest<br>Determination<br>(BID)   | LEAs must make school placement determinations based on the "best interest" of the HCY and student-centered factors. | Attendance<br>Procedure                   | The LEA has an ongoing obligation to remove barriers to the enrollment and retention of homeless children and youths. | Transportation                         | LEA/Charter Districts ensure that transportation is provided, at the request of the parent or guardian (or in the case of an unaccompanied youth, the McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison), to and from the school of origin. Transportation arrangements and coordination it to established promptly to ensure immediate enrollment and so as not to create barriers to homeless students' attendance, retention, and success. 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| End of Year<br>Written<br>Notification | The LEA has developed, and shall review and revise, policies to remove barriers to the identification, enrollment, and retention of HCY for the duration of homelessness and until the end of the school year in which the student becomes permanently housed. | McKinney-Vento<br>Staff and<br>Employee<br>Awareness | The LEA shall ensure that school personnel providing services to HCY and UHY receive professional learning and other support. The LEA will provide evidence of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison's efforts to inform school personnel of the educational rights of HCY and UHY.  Professional learning provided by the LEA Liaison shall address the needs of the LEA, local region and shall represent the needs of the State. 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| Internal Data Tracking Sheet                         | The McKinney-Vento Act requires the gathering and reporting of reliable, valid, and comprehensive information and data on HCY. The information collected is then provided to the federal government to disseminate relevant data to stakeholders. HCY and UHY enrollment data must be entered into the SIS throughout the school year, not at its conclusion. This helps your LEA ensure that the enrollment numbers are accurate at any given time throughout the school year and provides consistent opportunities for your McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison and data team to run enrollment data integrity reports to check against their internal tracking systems. | HCY Needs<br>Assessment                              | LEAs are responsible for conducting an annual HCY needs assessment to support the enrollment, attendance, and success of these children and youths.
