

Under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, every local educational agency (LEA), which includes charters, is required to designate a McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison to identify and ensure the educational rights for children and youth experiencing homelessness. McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaisons coordinate services to ensure that children and youth experiencing homelessness enroll in school and have the opportunity to succeed academically (42 U.S.C. §§11431-11432).

LEAs are statutorily required to ensure that designated McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaisons have sufficient time and capacity to carry out the required duties to ensure compliance with the law. The McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison Duties document describes those duties and serves as a tool for liaisons to assess their capacity to carry out these duties (42 US Code §11432 (g)(7)(A)).

McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaisons are required to develop, review, revise policies and procedures to remove barriers to the identification, immediate enrollment, and school retention of children and youth experiencing homelessness (42 USC §11432(g)(1)(I), Arizona ESEA Consolidated State Plan).

To assist with this requirement, the ADE Homeless Education Program works collaboratively with LEAs to help develop locally-driven policies and procedures to support children and youth experiencing homelessness to ensure the removal of barriers. The guidance document is comprised of required policies, procedures, and documents to equip McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaisons with the tools to meet statutory compliance requirements and effectively serve children and youth experiencing homelessness.

In developing guidance, the ADE Homeless Education Program ensures that all elements are grounded in the statutory requirements detailed in the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, as well as in consultation with the National Center for Homeless Education (NCHE) and SchoolHouse Connection. By referencing these resources and partners, it is the objective of the ADE Homeless Education Program to provide McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaisons with comprehensive and relevant resources.

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	Every LEA must have a written internal plan detailing the responsible personnel, process (i.e., sequential steps to be taken), and timeline required to provide written notification and assistance to parents, guardians, and UHY in preparing and filing disputes at both the LEA and SEA levels.

	If a dispute arises over eligibility, school selection, or enrollment and related services, the LEA must immediately enroll, transport, and provide all services to children and youth experiencing homelessness for the school in which enrollment is sought until the final resolution of the dispute, including all available appeals.		
Identification & Immediate Enrollment	The LEA has an ongoing obligation to remove barriers to the immediate enrollment and retention of HCY. A procedure should be in place to ensure the removal of barriers to enrollment, as may occur in the absence of records normally required for enrollment, missed application or enrollment deadlines during a period of homelessness, outstanding fees, or obtaining or sharing records due to movement to or from another school or district. Arizona Student Residency Questionnaire	LEAs are required to establish a coordinated referral process to determine eligibility consistently to coordinate or expedite referrals for services and coordinate services overall for families or youths to improve education and other outcomes for homeless children and youths. To identify homeless students, LEAs are required to use either an electronic or hard copy of the Arizona Student Residency Questionnaire. Caregiver's Authorization Affidavit	LEAs are required to establish a coordinated referral process to determine eligibility consistently to coordinate or expedite referrals for services and coordinate services overall for families or youths to improve education and other outcomes for homeless children and youths. There are situations when a child or youth who is homeless may not be able to reside with their parent or guardian; however, this fact does not nullify the child's or youth's right to receive a free, appropriate public education. In this situation, the child may be considered an unaccompanied youth. The term unaccompanied homeless youth is a youth who is not in the physical custody of a parent or court-appointed guardian. Best Interest Determination (BID)	LEAs must make school placement determinations based on the "best interest" of the HCY and student-centered factors. Attendance Procedure	The LEA has an ongoing obligation to remove barriers to the enrollment and retention of homeless children and youths. Transportation	LEA/Charter Districts ensure that transportation is provided, at the request of the parent or guardian (or in the case of an unaccompanied youth, the McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison), to and from the school of origin. Transportation arrangements and coordination it to established promptly to ensure immediate enrollment and so as not to create barriers to homeless students' attendance, retention, and success. End of Year Written Notification	The LEA has developed, and shall review and revise, policies to remove barriers to the identification, enrollment, and retention of HCY for the duration of homelessness and until the end of the school year in which the student becomes permanently housed. To this end, McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaisons should re-evaluate the housing of HCY prior to the beginning of each school year to verify that the student still lacks fixed, regular, and adequate housing.	42 U.S.C. §§11432 (g)(1)(I); (g)(3)(A)(i)	ADE End of Year Notification Letter Sample
McKinney-Vento Staff and Employee Awareness	The LEA shall ensure that school personnel providing services to HCY and UHY receive professional learning and other support. The LEA will provide evidence of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison's efforts to inform school personnel of the educational rights of HCY and UHY. Internal Data Tracking Sheet	The McKinney-Vento Act requires the gathering and reporting of reliable, valid, and comprehensive information and data on HCY. The information collected is then provided to the federal government to disseminate relevant data to stakeholders. HCY and UHY enrollment data must be entered into the SIS throughout the school year, not at its conclusion. This helps your LEA ensure that the enrollment numbers are accurate at any given time throughout the school year and provides consistent opportunities for your McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison and data team to run enrollment data integrity reports to check against their internal tracking systems. HCY Needs Assessment	LEAs are responsible for conducting an annual HCY needs assessment to support the enrollment, attendance, and success of these children and youths.
