## Do we have to use the ADE provided Student Residency Questionnaire?

"LEAs are required to **review** and **revise** policies and procedures to **remove barriers** to the identification of homeless children and youths, and the enrollment and retention of homeless children and youths in schools in the State, including **barriers** to **enrollment** and **retention** due to outstanding fees or fines, or absences."

<u>42 U.S.C. § 11432(g)(1)(I)</u>

#### McKinney-Vento Act

"To properly **identify** homeless students in the State of Arizona, LEAs are **required** to use either an electronic or hard copy of the **Student Residency Housing Questionnaire**."

# What questions are appropriate to ask parents or students?

"Local educational agency liaisons for homeless children and youths shall, as a part of their duties, coordinate and collaborate with State Coordinators and community and school personnel responsible for the provision of education and related services to homeless children and youths. Such coordination shall include collecting and providing to the State Coordinator the **reliable**, **valid**, and comprehensive data needed to meet the requirements of paragraphs (1) and (3) of subsection (f)."

42 U.S.C. § 11432(g)(6)(C)

#### McKinney-Vento Act

"Upon the identification and enrollment of homeless students, LEAs are **required** to **assess the needs** presented by the students through locally developed informal **needs assessment tools**."

- Develop rapport and trust.
- Allow parents, guardians and youth to share their story.
- Consider consulting with school staff and community partners to gather information about the student's situation
- Consult with school staff, community partners and others providing support to the family to gather additional details.

"The term "homeless children and youths"—

(A) means individuals who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence (within the meaning of section 11302(a)(1) of this title); and includes

(i) children and youths who are sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason;

## If a family continues to live in shared housing moving into the new school year, can they still qualify for McKinney-Vento?

"According to the child's or youth's best interest, the LEA shall continue the child's or youth's education in the school of origin for the duration of homelessness, becomes homeless between or during an academic year, and for the remainder of the academic year, if the child or youth becomes permanently housed during the academic year."

<u>42 U.S.C. § 11432(g)(3)(A)</u>

#### McKinney-Vento Act

"When the child or youth completes the final grade level served by the school of origin, the "school of origin" shall include the designated receiving school at the next grade level for all feeder schools.

42 U.S.C. § 11432(g)(3)(I)(iii)

#### McKinney-Vento Act

"Each LEA is required to designate a Homeless Education Liaison to collaborate with school personnel and community-based organizations to identify and immediately enroll homeless students. To identify homeless students, LEAs are required to use either an electronic or hard copy of the Housing Questionnaire. Once identified, all eligible students are to be immediately enrolled, even when lacking enrollment records or documentation, such as previous academic records, immunization and other health records, proof of residency, and proof of legal guardianship."

## If a family continues to live in shared housing moving into the new school year, can they still qualify for McKinney-Vento?

- There is no time limit on McKinney-Vento eligibility, as it depends on the student's living situation.
- LEAs/Charter Districts are required to develop, review, revise policies and procedures to remove barriers to the identification, enrollment, and retention of students experiencing homelessness.
- If your LEA has implemented limitations by implementing a standard practice, this is a violation to the identification and rights of HCY.



**Guidance Regarding Re-Evaluations & Initial Evaluations** 

#### Dear Colleagues,

The purpose of this notification is to provide you with **urgent technical assistance** support pertaining to the **re-evaluation** and initial **evaluations** for **McKinney-Vento eligibility** as we begin the new school year.

Over the past couple of weeks, our Office has received numerous questions regarding reevaluation and initial evaluation policies and procedures for determining McKinney-Vento eligibility. To this end, we acknowledge the importance of equipping you with information regarding legal requirements, considerations, and resources as you handle the responsibility of properly identifying, enrolling, and servicing students experiencing homelessness.

#### Legal Requirements

There is **no time limit on McKinney-Vento eligibility**, as it depends on the student's living situation.



#### I have a student who has chosen to live with his aunt, and she does not have custody. Mom is stating he does not want to follow her rules and she did not kick him out and has a home to go to. Is he considered an unaccompanied homeless youth?

"In determining the best interest of the child or youth under subparagraph (A), the local educational agency shall in the case of an unaccompanied youth, ensure that the local educational agency liaison designated under paragraph (1)(J)(ii) assists in placement or enrollment decisions under this subparagraph, gives priority to the views of such unaccompanied youth, and provides notice to such youth of the right to appeal under subparagraph (E)."

42 U.S.C. § 11432(g)(3)(B)(iv)

# Is he considered an unaccompanied homeless youth?

- During the interview process consider interviewing the student, caregiver, parent, others supporting the student.
- What did you learn?
- The safest place for a child or youth to be is in school.
- Utilizing the Caregiver's Authorization Affidavit is a tool for LEA's to document the living situation involving the HCY.

#### ADE Caregiver's Authorization Affidavit (Sample Form)

The information on this form is required to meet The Education for Homeless Children and Youth (EHCY) program, authorized under Title VII-B of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11431 et seq.), also known as the McKinney-Vento Act. There are situations when a child or youth who is homeless may not be able to reside with their parent or guardian; however, this fact does not nullify the child'siyouth's right to receive a free, appropriate public education. This form is not a legal document and solely for school contact only.

The adult "caregiver" requesting enrollment for a minor student presenting him/herself for enrollment and educational services while not in the physical custody of a parent or legal guardian shall complete this form.

#### By signing below, I acknowledge the following:

- I am 18 years of age or older and have agreed to fulfill the role of caregiver for the minor student named below, who is unaccompanied by a parent or legal guardian.
- I agree to make a good faith effort to encourage the minor student named below to attend school.
- I will attempt to contact the school office if I become aware that the minor student named below will not be
  attending school on that day(s) and share whether the absence is with or without my approval.
- I have provided the school district with proof of my residence and personal identification.
   I understand that signing this document does not make me the legal guardian of the minor student listed below or
- Inderstand that againing this document does not have me the legal guardiant or the minor student inset below or make me financially responsible for the minor student, even if I am providing financial support to the student.
   I understand that I may choose to make educational decisions on behalf of the minor and in all other ways stand
- Linderstand that it may choose to make educational decisions on behalf of the minor and in all other ways stand in for the authorizing party with respect to federal, state and district educational policy, including, but not limited to, accessing the minor's educational records, representing the minor in enrollment, disciplinary, curricular, special education or other matters, signing permission slips for school activities, and any other decision that facilitates the minor's educational experience.

LEAs should establish a process to conduct internal data integrity uploads at least once every two weeks.



LEAs are required to ensure all data has been uploaded accurately prior to 6/30/2024 to meet compliance.

# If our district does not provide transportation for any student, are we required to provide it for McKinney-Vento students?

"The local educational agency described in subparagraph (B)(ii) shall—(i) implement a **coordinated system** for ensuring that homeless children and youths—(III) are **promptly** provided necessary services described in subsection (g)(4), including **transportation**, to allow homeless children and youths to exercise their choices of schools. (g)(3)(A);"

42 U.S.C. §11432(e)(3)(E)(i)

"Each homeless child or youth to be assisted under this part shall be provided **services comparable** to services offered to other students in the school selected under paragraph (3), including the following: (A) **Transportation services**..."

42 U.S.C. § 11432(g)(4)(A)

"However, some situations exist in which an LEA must provide transportation assistance for a student experiencing homelessness that may exceed what is provided to other students because LEAs and schools are required to remove barriers to the school enrollment and attendance of children and youth experiencing homelessness, including transportation barriers."

## If our district does not provide transportation for any student, are we required to provide it for **McKinney-Vento students?**

#### Yes!

The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act requires school districts to consider the school of origin as the first option in school enrollment. Parents may choose the school of origin or the school in the residency the area where the child(ren) currently live (school of residency may also be referred to as local area attendance school). Individuals who may be consulted when determining what placement is in the child(ren)'s best interest include the following:

district/charter homeless experiencing homelessness parent quardian or school site personnel (e.g. caregiver of the child(ren) or counselor, social worker, SPED teacher, etc.), and

It is the school district's responsibility to determine the school of origin and residency, and to resolve any conflict concerning the school placement by focusing on the best interest of the child(ren). Whenever possible, the school district should comply with the wishes of the parent, guardian, caregiver, or youth . If the school district and parent, guardian, caregiver, or youth do not agree on the appropriate placement, the school district's Dispute Resolution Procedure must be followed. In such cases, the child(ren) should be enrolled in the school that the parent, guardian, caregiver, or youth has chosen until the conclusion of the resolution process (42 U.S.C. §11432 (g)(3)(B)). If the school of origin is determined to be the best placement, the local McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaisons of both the school of origin and local attendance area school must work together to arrange transportation (42 U.S.C. §11432 (g)(1)(J)(iii)(II)).

The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act requires that a child or youth experiencing homelessness attends:

- · School of origin: School of origin is defined as "the school that a child or youth attended when permanently housed or the school in which the child or youth was last enrolled, including a preschool". Further, "when the child or youth completes the final grade level served by the school of origin, the term school of origin shall include the designated receiving school at the next grade level for all feeder schools (42 U.S.C. §11432(g)(3)(I)(I)) or
- · Local attendance area school: Local attendance area school is defined as "any public school that non homeless students who live in the attendance area in which the child or youth is actually living (42 U.S.C. §11432(g)(3)(A)(I)(ii)).

Whether the child or youth will attend the school of origin or the local attendance area sc enrollment should take place immediately (42 U.S.C. §11432(g)(3)(C))

The information collected during this process supports the agreement in determining the school enrollment in the best interest of the child or youth experiencing homelessness and will provide the input required to develop a written notification should the parent, guardian, caregiver, or youth disagree with the decision

According to Arizona's ESSA State Plan, McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaisons must utilize the Bes nterest Determination (BID) Form to make school enrollment decisions when necessary. This sample form has been developed by the ADE Office of Homeless Education to assist LEAs in the procedural development and implementation of the BID to ensure school enrollment decisions are driven by the best interest of the student.

The McKinney-Vento Education for Homeless Children and Youth Act provides a definition of homelessness for children and youths to be used by state educational agencies (SEAs) and local educational agencies (LEAs). It defines homelessness for children and youth to be those who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate ighttime residence (42 U.S.C. § 11434a(2)

"The McKinney-Vento Act's transportation requirements apply while disputes are being resolved. Therefore, at the request of the parent, guardian, or unaccompanied youth, the LEA must provide or arrange for adequate and appropriate transportation to and from the school selected by the parent, guardian, or unaccompanied youth.

Inter-district transportation disputes should be resolved at the SEA level."

#### Undergo the following steps:

- Reach out to the Office of the State Coordinator's office for support and though-partnering.
- Keep documentation regarding all efforts to resolve the transportation request.
- Establish your LEA's dispute resolution procedures and know where the forms are located at.
- Learn where the State level forms for LEA vs LEA disputes.
- Determine an alternative plan to support the student's transportation in the interim of awaiting response from the shared LEA.

- Students in Foster Care
  - Students in the foster care are <u>not</u> counted in HCY enrollment data, as per the 2015 Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).
- Preschool-Aged HCY Children
  - Children ages 3-5 years **are included** in your LEA's total enrolled HCY, **if they are enrolled in a preschool program provided by your LEA**.
  - Children ages 0-2, or 3-5, and not enrolled in a preschool program at your LEA, are not included in your total enrolled HCY count.
- HCY & UHY Students
  - Identified HCY are required to have their needs identifier and corresponding primary nighttime residence entered in the student information system (SIS).
  - Identified <u>UHY must be coded with both the HCY and UHY need identifiers</u> and must have the same corresponding primary nighttime residence in your SIS.
    - For example, a student who is experiencing homelessness **and** is unaccompanied would be **entered into the SIS with both the HCY and the UHY need identifiers**, along with the **same primary nighttime residence code for each need** (i.e., HCY and UHY).
- If There's a Change in Status for HCY/UHY Students
  - Once students are identified and enrolled in your LEA, do not remove their HCY or UHY need identifiers in your SIS, even if they transfer to another LEA.
  - If HCY/UHY students' circumstances change, such as they find permanent housing, **do not remove their HCY or UHY need identifiers in your SIS**.

LEAs must ensure that your LEA's reported HCY and UHY enrollment counts are complete and accurate in AzEDS by Friday, December 8th.
