


### High School Exiting Data

### For Students with Disabilities

Arizona students with an Individualized Education Program (IEP) who exited high school during the 2021–2022 school year.




-26% of AZ youths with IEPs dropped out, compared to the national average of 17%.

# <1%

of AZ youths with IEPs exited due to reaching maximum age.



**73%** of AZ youths with IEPs were engaged in some sort of education, employment, or training within one year of leaving high school, compared to the national average of 74%.



### 67%

of AZ youths with IEPs and aged 16+ had a transition plan that included eight components relating to education, training, employment, and independent living, compared to the national average of 85%.



19%

of AZ youths with IEPs enrolled in higher education within one year of exiting high school, compared to the national average of 22%.



## 38%

of AZ youths with IEPs were competitively employed within one year of exiting high school, compared to the national average of 39%.
