

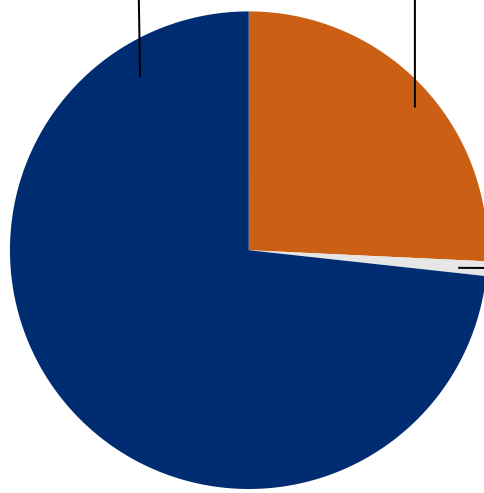
High School Exiting Data

of AZ youths with IEPs graduated with a regular high school diploma, compared to the national average of 82%.

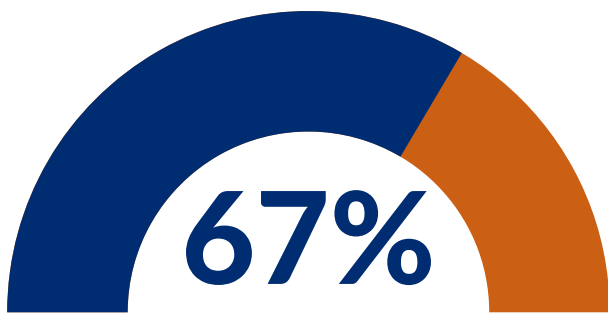


26%

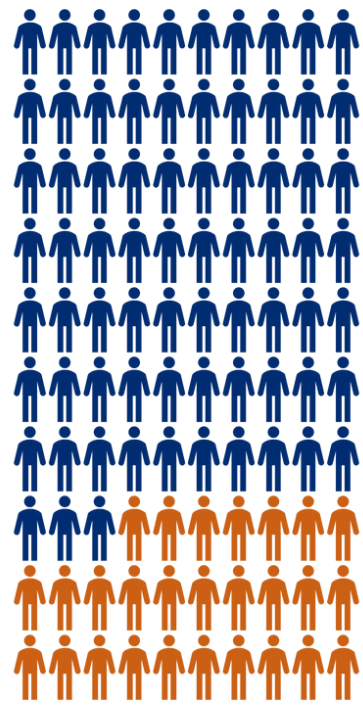
of AZ youths with IEPs exited due to reaching maximum age.



of AZ youths with IEPs and aged 16+ had a transition plan that included eight components relating to education, training, employment, and independent living, compared to the national average of 85%.

of AZ youths with IEPs enrolled in higher education within one year of exiting high school, compared to the national average of 22%.



38%

of AZ youths with IEPs were competitively employed within one year of exiting high school, compared to the national average of 39%.
