- Funding is pending availability of federal/state funds and approval by the Arizona State Board of Education
- 25% local match of non-federal cash/in-kind is required
- Earned income (such as fees collected) may not be used for the match
- 100% of earned income generated by the grant award must be used for adult education instructional services



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# Overview of Grant Application - Part 1

### **KEY ELEMENTS**

### **Demonstrated Effectiveness**

To meet the standard of demonstrated effectiveness and be considered eligible for funding, an applicant must provide evidence of demonstrated effectiveness by providing performance data on its record in improving the literacy skills of eligible individuals, in particular individuals who are basic-skills deficient in the content domains of reading, writing, mathematics, English language acquisition, and other subject areas relevant to the services contained in this application for funds. To be considered eligible, an applicant must also provide information regarding its outcomes for participants related to employment, attainment of secondary school diploma (or its recognized equivalent), and transition to postsecondary education or training. (WIOA Final Rules Subpart C, §463.24)





- The Local Match and Earned Income Report template is available in the GME 'FY 2025 Adult Education Consolidated Year 1 funding application.'
- Reports are to be submitted by uploading in the Related Documents section.

Note: Applicants selected for funding may participate in a negotiation process between ADE-AES and the applicant/parent organization. Final grant awards may be adjusted for successful applicants following the negotiation process.

- ☐ If provider intends to charge supplemental fees, application must be submitted to and approved by ADE/AES
- ☐ Grantee must provide a 25% minimum local match for state grant funds.

#### Highlighted Requirements:

- ☐ Local provider will fully implement the *Arizona Adult Education Teacher Standards*.
- ☐ The local provider will compensate all adult educators for required professional learning activities and provide sufficient paid time for instructional planning.
- ☐ The local provider will ensure print and digital curricular resources are aligned to the *Arizona Adult Education Content Standards*.



### **KEY ELEMENTS**

#### Data Quality Specifications

Based on NRS requirements



Highlighted Data Quality Specifications:

- ☐ Program staff must be trained in privacy protection, FERPA, data collection and data entry.
- Requires written processes and internal audits for data processes.
- Requires the identification of staff responsible for data decisions and approval.
- ☐ Adheres to the *Arizona Adult Education Assessment Policy*


