What is the Annual Performance Report?

The Annual Performance Report...

- ✓ Is the Federal Reporting each 21st CCLC funded center completes related to their programming each year
- Helps us (as recipients of this federal funding) tell the story of 21st CCLC to Congress
- MISSION CRITICAL for continued 21st CCLC funding





What's the APR (continued)

How is the APR determined?

GPRA= Government Performance and Results Act

Identifies Outcomes for **APR** and requires additional data collection as determined by the Department of Education.





What's included?

What data is reported in the APR?

Data about what took place with the 21st CCLC funds (Process)

Data about the results of participation in the program (Outcomes)





 If GPRA measure only asks about grades 1-5, will only report this GPRA for grades 1-5



What are the GPRAs?

GPRA 1- State Assessment	Percentage of students in grades 4–8 participating in 21st CCLC programming during the school year and summer who demonstrate growth in reading/language arts on state assessments.
	Percentage of students in grades 4–8 participating in 21st CCLC programming during the school year and summer who demonstrate growth in mathematics on state assessments.
GPRA 2- GPA	Percentage of students in grades 7-8 and 10-12 attending 21st CCLC programming during the school year and summer with a prior-year unweighted GPA of less than 3.0 who demonstrated an improved GPA.
GPRA 3- School Day Attendance	Percentage of students in grades 1-12 participating in 21st CCLC during the school year who had a school day attendance rate at or below 90% in the prior school year and demonstrated an improved attendance rate in the current school year.
GPRA 4- In-School Suspension	Percentage of students in grades 1-12 attending 21st CCLC programming during the school year and summer who experienced a decrease in in-school suspensions compared to the previous school year.
GPRA 5- Teacher Survey	Percentage of students in grades 1-5 participating in 21st CCLC programming in the school year and summer who demonstrated an improvement in teacher reported engagement in learning.

2023-2024 = this/current reporting year

- Determine APR data collection policies
 - Things to consider:
 - → Grade levels served (not every Outcome for every grade level)
 - → If applicable, Teacher Survey strategy
 - → Who has/needs access to data- especially In-School Suspension Data
 - \rightarrow Who will be responsible for each aspect?
 - → Reach out to the Data Inbox for further startup support and assistance






APR Due Dates for 2023-2024

 - Process Data- Overview of the Grantee, Partnerships, Activities, Staffing, Family Engagement
 - Outcome Data- Student Level Data
- Due Dates
 - Process Data- Due by June 19, 2024
 - Outcome Data- Due by September 11, 2024
 - You cannot report Outcomes Data until Attendance is complete!
 - Attendance to be finalized on or around July 15th
