

Dropout Recovery Program Procedures Revised: 9/5/2023

I. PURPOSE

A. To provide an official process to allow LEAs the ability to offer a Dropout Recovery Program to enhance the services provided to youth that have dropped out of high school.

II. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

A. Arizona Revised Statue <u>15-901.06</u> states that each school district and charter district that provides instruction to high school pupils may offer a dropout recovery program for eligible pupils.

III. PROCEDURE

- A. Interested LEA's must first apply/renew annually during the Alternative School application window, which opens in February leading into the following school year they wish to operate a DRP. This window closes in March, and alternative school status notices are released in May for the upcoming school year.

- C. Once approved for Alternative School Status, the LEA will need to complete the following for DRP approval (*for initial and renewal DRP approval*):
 - a) DRP Assurance
 - b) List of School Name and School ID in which your DRP operates
 - c) Written Learning Plan template containing the following:
 - Start and anticipated end dates
 - Courses to be completed by the pupil during the academic year
 - Specify if the courses listed will be taken sequentially or concurrently



- Expectations for satisfactory monthly progress
- d) Your agency's definition of Satisfactory Monthly Progress
- e) If LEA uses a 3rd party provider, documentation of their regional accreditation
- f) Charter Schools Only
 - If a charter district is sponsored by the Arizona State Board for Charter Schools:
 - Charter holder shall submit a program of instruction amendment request to the Arizona State Board for Charter Schools that adds methods of instruction for the dropout recovery program.
 - If necessary, the charter agreement shall be amended by the Arizona State Board for Charter Schools to be consistent with the addition of a dropout recovery program. Amendments necessary may include but not limited to:
 - Expansion requests
 - Charter mission amendment request
 - Instructional days amendment request
