Quick Summary

Foster Care

24-hour (a day) substitute care for children placed away from their parents or guardians and for whom the child welfare agency (DCS, tribal, or local) has placement and care responsibility.

Children in foster care are not considered 'homeless' or McKinney-Vento eligible.

Fostering Connections Act

The child welfare agency must have a plan for school stability

CWA Assurances

- placement considers the appropriateness of the current educational setting and the proximity to the school in which the child is enrolled at the time of placement; and
- coordination to ensure that the child remains in the school in which the child is enrolled at the time of placement; or
- if remaining in such school is not in the best interests of the child, the CWA and LEA provide immediate and appropriate enrollment in a new school, with all the educational records of the child provided to the school

Foster Care School Stability Steps

Student enters foster care or has a change in foster care placement

Student remains at the school of origin while the LEA & child welfare agency execute the BID process

BID

BID Outcome: Stay in School of Origin

LEA & child welfare agency collaborate on transportation

BID Outcome: Do Not Stay in School of Origin

The new school immediately enrolls the student, even without all paperwork.

3 Realms of ACEs

ACEs Connection accelerates the global movement to prevent and heal adverse childhood experiences (ACEs), and supports communities to work collaboratively to solve our most intractable problems. Left unaddressed, toxic stress from ACEs harms children and families, organizations, systems and communities, and reduces the ability of individuals and entities to respond to stressful events with resiliency. The ACEs in these three realms intertwine throughout people's lives, and affect the viability of organizations, systems and communities.

Behaviors at School

Question

Potential Common Characteristics

- Hoarding
- Developmentally Delayed
- Inappropriate attachment
- Parentified, especially with siblings
- Self Sabotage



Helpful School Environments

- Understanding school staff
(especially with school
discipline)
- Tardiness/ Unexcused
absences for foster care
reasons
- Regulated Adults

PCEs

Talk to family about feelings	Felt support from family during difficult times
Participate in community traditions	Felt sense of belonging in HS
Felt supported by friends	At least 2 non-parent adults took interest in you
Felt safe/protected by an adult at home
