History

- Enacted via the McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Assistance Act of 1987
- Reauthorized by Title IX, Part A of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) of 2015
 - EHCY Funding

Purpose

- Supplement services
- Eliminate barriers for children and youth experiencing homelessness:
 - Identification
 - Enrollment
 - Attendance
 - Academic success

EHCY SEA Subgrant Requirements

- Annual allocation from the USDE
 - Based on annual reporting of homeless enrollment numbers
- Minimum of 75% must be sub-granted to LEAs
- Competitive subgrant process at least once every three years
 - Recipients of the 3 –year competitive subgrants are required to submit a continuation application for each of the remaining 2 years of the grant project

EHCY Subgrant Requirements for LEAs


- Supplement, not supplant
- Eliminate barriers for children and youth experiencing homelessness:
 - Identification
 - Enrollment
 - Attendance
 - Academic success
- 16 allowable activities
 - Outreach and identification
 - Immediate enrollment
 - School stability
 - Transportation
 - Educational & wrap-around services

Considerations: Shared Responsibility

When preparing the FY25 EHCY Continuation Grant application, consult with multiple stakeholders to ensure well-rounded analysis of need, effective programming, and to avoid supplanting

Considerations: Data Context



Identification is critical to the success of both students and local programs

Considerations: FY25 EHCY Funds

Cover excess cost to remove the barriers to ...

- Identification, retention, attendance, and academic success
 - Increased staff capacity stipends & salaries
 - Contracts w/CBOs
- School retention and attendance
 - Provision of transportation
 - Contracts w/CBOs or vendors
- Academic success
 - Paying AP exam , SAT/ACT, and dual-enrollment fees
- Identification and immediate enrollment
 - Acquiring previous academic records, birth certificates, and immunization records

 Required number of program narrative questions for the FY25 EHCY Continuation Grant

Program Narrative Questions FY25 EHCY Continuation Grant

- Responses to Program Narrative Questions should demonstrate the LEA's current data, identified needs, and programmatic plans to address need utilizing EHCY funds
- The questions are organized into four sections for a total of 12 questions:

Needs Assessment: 1-3

Academic Achievement Goals: 4-6

Programmatic Goals: 7-9

LEA's HEP Management Plan: 10-12

Considerations for Program Narrative Responses

Data Clarification

- District-approved standards-benchmark assessments do not include the following:
 - Required State Assessments
 - i.e., AASA, ACT Aspire, AzSCI, etc.
 - ACT & SAT
 - Teacher-made assessments & class grades
- Stakeholder Clarification
 - Program narrative question #12 requires a description of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison's active role in the decision-making process

 Budget Narrative Description Requirements

Required Documentation

Budget Requirements

The budget must:

- Ensure that the proposed subgrant funds are fully allocated
- Be in alignment with the following:
 - The needs and goals identified in program narrative questions
 - The documentation uploaded into the Related Documents

Budget Narrative Description Requirements

Ensure that funds are supplemental by:

- Clearly indicating that no other funds are available for the expenditure requested
- Indicating that the expenditure is exclusively to meet the needs of students who are experiencing homelessness
- Indicating that services or supplies requested are not provided for students who are not experiencing homelessness from other sources
- Providing the data that was used to determine the need including the number of homeless students anticipated to benefit from the expenditure
- Indicating the responsibilities of staff receiving stipends and ensuring the responsibilities are performed outside the employee's normal contract hours
- Uploading Board approved job descriptions in the Related Documents section for all salary (FTE) positions
- Indicating dissemination process and safeguards that ensure expenditures are used for their intended purpose

Required Documentation

- Board approved job description for grant-funded salary positions
- Vendor contracts paid from grant funds
 - Including, documents detailing all instructional and non-instructional contracted services scheduled for the school year and summer learning sessions
- "Collaborations within the Community" Document
- FY24 EHCY consortium subgrantee must up the following Documents into their FY25 EHCY Continuation grant Application in "Related Documents":
 - Updated Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)
 - Reflecting current funding amount for each member
 - Certification & Assurances for each member

Funding Formula

FY25 EHCY Continuation Grant

The formula below can be used to calculate the *maximum* amount of funding an applicant may be eligible to be awarded. Official awards are dependent on the quality of the grant application and the amount that the USDE awards ADE to subgrant to LEAs

Funding Formula

(Division Allocation) + (F/R%) + (Homeless % Tier) = Approximated Allocation Award

Base Allocation

Base Allocation = 12,000

The base allocation amount is also used to determine incremental changes below.

FY25 EHCY Continuation: Approximating Award Example

LEA B reported 3,000 students enrolled as of October 1, 2023, a 40% free and reduced lunch rate, and 7% homelessness rate.

- 3,000 students enrolled = Division I = \$12,000 base allocation
- 40% F/R% = Tier II = + (\$12,000 x 2) = \$24,000
- 7% Homeless % = Tier II = + (\$12,000 x 2) = \$24,000
- \$12,000 + \$24,000 + \$24,000
- Approximate Award Amount to Budget: \$60,000

- Project Availability for FY25 July 1, 2024 September 30, 2025
 - Carryover allowed for FY24 to FY25
 No carryover allowed from FY25 to FY26
