15 The following reviewed products indicated violations of the Buy American Provision in 7CFR 210.21(d) on-site at Traditional School -Gilbert, Legacy Traditional School – Goodyear, Legacy Traditional School - San Tan, Traditional FAQ. Funds used from the non-profit School - West Suprise and Legacy Traditional School - Deer Valley and Legacy Traditional School - Glendale for Frozen vegetable blend, frozen Broccoli, Cholula hot sauce (Product of Mexico) and Tajin (Product of Mexico). Additionally, documentation justifying a Buy American exception was not maintained/on file.
