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


Convening Purpose







The Office of Indian Education (OIE) invites all Indigenous education stakeholders from across the state of Arizona to participant in the OIE Stakeholder Summit!

Participants will gather in-person over the course of 3 days to discuss, evaluate and create programs and policies that support Indigenous education for students and communities within Arizona.

STUDENTS

OIE is defining student as youth entering 8th grade through 12th grade. This track also includes individuals that are teacher candidates currently attending post-secondary institutions

PARENT/CAREGIVER

OIE is defining this role as adults who have children that attend K-12 schools in Arizona and are NOT attending the summit as a representative of a school district, charter network or tribal nation.

EDUCATION STAFF

OIE is defining this role as adults who serve K-12 students and NOT serving in a leadership or administrative capacity. This includes but is not limited to classified/certified staff, tribal liaisons, Native American program staff, or any individual supporting Indigenous students.


LEADERSHIP/ADMINISTRATOR

OIE is defining this role as adults who serve in a leadership capacity within K-12 educational environments OR Tribal, State, Federal and Non-profit entities. This includes individuals such as district admins, tribal education department directors or CEOs of non-profit organizations.

Tribal Regalia at Graduation



On April 20, 2021, Governor Ducey signed <u>Arizona HB 2705</u> which supports Indigenous student's right to celebrate commencement in a culturally appropriate way that is deeply important for Indigenous students.

66—

A school district governing board, a charter school governing body or any public school may not prohibit a student who is a member of a federally recognized tribe or who is eligible to be enrolled as a member of a federally recognized Indian tribe from wearing traditional tribal regalia or objects of cultural significance at a graduation ceremony.


- Arizona Revised Statute 15-348

Why is this important?

- Graduation is a time of celebration and community.
- Ability to wear tribal regalia at commencement honors Indigenous culture and heritage
- High school graduation is a pivotal, once-in-alifetime achievement, tribal regalia are worn during times of traditional ceremonies or important life events, thus, honoring the occasion


