Library Career Discovery Corner Grades 4-5

Activity Description

Students visit this section of the library weekly. It contains age-appropriate career resources, preparation for field trips to local high school CTE programs, and guest speakers who explain their career journey and daily job responsibilities.

Activity Description

Take students to the local library or visit online. Locate resources in local, regional, and national libraries.

Students work together in teams of 4 to create art without an expected outcome. The activity starts with each student drawing something on paper. Each author explains their work and others contribute a second, third, etc. drawing until the artwork is complete.

Activity Description

Students study the word of the month, create images to depict the word and share their work with the group.

Title of Activity

Career Exposures

Activity Description

Students experience career exposure in the library on a bi-weekly basis. This includes short videos and fun worksheets.

Activity Title

Build a Bridge Project



Activity_Description

The librarian reviews how problem-solving skills, creativity, collaboration, and communication are important to teamwork. In teams, students will construct a bridge made from popsicle sticks and record the angles and dimensions of the structure. Students will display their bridges at Open house.

Resources

Popsicle sticks, glue, and online instructions.

A mechanical engineer to speak to the class.

Desired Outcomes

Students practice collaboration, problem-solving, creativity, and courteous communication skills. Students will decide on the kind of bridge they will make (suspension bridge, draw bridge, or truss bridge) Students will build a structure within 2-3 class periods. Students will measure angles and dimensions to create a schematic of their bridge.
