Specifically, cheeseburger bun served at Dysart High School, during lunch meal service on January 13, 14, 15, 16, & 17 credited as 2.0 oz eq grains per the product formulation statement; however, the production record indicated it contained 3.0 oz eq grains.
- 4 Production record crediting is inaccurate. Specifically, corn chips served at Dysart High School during lunch meal service on January 13, 15, & 17, credited as 1.25 oz eq per 1.0 oz serving, according to the product formulation statement; however, the recipe indicated that 2 oz chips were offered per serving, and the production record indicated it contained 2.0 oz eq grains.
