Cafeteria staff have not been properly trained on Offer versus Serve (OVS) meal service.

Discussed that schools are expected to conduct training for point of service and serving line staff so they can help students select the required food components/food items in the quantities needed for reimbursable lunches and breakfasts. Additionally discussed that this could be included in the annual training requirements for program staff.
