

FY25 ESEA Programmatic Monitoring McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act Cycle 3 Main Requirement 5 Desktop Monitoring Data Collection Tasks

The Arizona Department of Education (ADE) Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) Programmatic Monitoring includes Main Requirement 5 in each of the four (4) monitoring cycles. Main Requirement 5 covers mandatory elements of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act for which every Local Education Agency (LEA) is required to implement.

The purpose of the **Cycle 3 Main Requirement 5 Desktop Monitoring Resource** addresses two essential requirements to support the development and implementation of effective LEA programming to benefit students experiencing homelessness:

- Provide the data collection task rationales, clarifications, resources, and guidance with LEAs, and
- Ensure transparency in the evaluation of LEA desktop monitoring submissions in Educational Monitoring, Assistance & Compliance (EMAC).

- <u>Data Collection Task A:</u> The response given by the LEA in the FY25 ESEA Consolidated Grant Application will be compared to the State of Arizona McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison Contact List to ensure alignment as the main point of contact for the LEA for Homeless Children and Youth.
- <u>Data Collection Task B:</u> Using the LEA's available evidence and/or data, fill out the form. Completion of all questions must be based on available evidence and or data sources, which could be requested for submission.

The LEA must demonstrate that the McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison contact information is consistent and accurate across the current ESEA Consolidated Grant and the State of Arizona McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaison Contact List. This alignment ensures compliance at both the LEA and SEA-levels, as well as streamline programmatic communication and support for all stakeholders, including site-based McKinney-Vento Homeless Liaisons, parents, guardians, caregivers, children, and youth experiencing homelessness throughout the State.

The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act requires State Educational Agencies (SEAs) and Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) to ensure that homeless children and youth have equal access to free, appropriate public education and are provided with necessary resources to remove barriers to enrollment, attendance, and success in school. A critical component of this requirement is public awareness and outreach to students and families experiencing homelessness through publicly displayed notices in accessible locations and in languages commonly spoken in the community. The LEA must demonstrate that its established internal written plan to disseminate and update the public awareness posters outlining the educational rights of homeless children and youth are posted in accessible locations and in languages commonly spoken in the community to inform parents, guardians, and unaccompanied homeless youth of their educational rights.
