





Johnson O'Malley (JOM) Funding Flow










ADE Updates

- FY26 Applications are currently Open –<u>Deadline May 1st</u>
 - -Starts July 1 and continues to September 30, 2026
- Budgets should be based on IEC Recommendations
- Allocations of funds focused on academic and cultural needs of Native American students
- Student counts due to ADE August 1, 2025

specialized need?

Is this cost an academic need?

Is this need funded by another program? JOM cannot supplant other funding.

Is the cost reasonable and necessary?

Is the cost included in the IEC approved budget?

Is this cost related to an eligible JOM student's unique and


Alowable Cost Caveats

Although an item may be allowable based on the examples provided, there are additional considerations:


 Items disallowed by a school district or tribal governing board will take precedence over this list

• All items must be approved by the parent Indian Education Committee (IEC) based on the student needs assessment and the associated education plan

- Read the statement
- Write in the chat if you think the statement is Allowable or Unallowable







Allowable costs related to food are generally limited to situations where the food directly supports educational activities or events



Target: *Children Ages* 8–12 **Length:** *90-Min Weekly Sessions for 5 Weeks* **Theme:** *Healthy Indigenous Foods and Traditions* **Recipe Example:** Three Sisters Soup (Corn, Beans, Squash)

Objectives:

- Teach students to cook healthy, traditional Indigenous meals
- Explore cultural significance of • Indigenous foods
- Help fight childhood obesity by promoting • healthy long term eating habits and addressing food insecurity at home

Class Format (90 Minutes):

1. Native American Chef Demo & Storytelling (30 min)

Chef prepares soup, shares its history and nutrition value

2. Hands-On Cooking (30 min)

3. Mealtime + Nutrition Talk (30 min)

Small group cooking with volunteers Emphasizes teamwork & basic cooking skills

Share meal together as a community Health expert discusses portion size, balanced meals, etc. Students receive take-home bag with healthy ingredients & recipe so foods can be shared at home
