## Performance Standard 2: Meal Components & Quantities -**Critical Area**

Vegetable subgroup quantities served at lunch during the review period did not meet minimum amounts required by the meal pattern. Specifically, 1/4 cup of beans/peas (legumes) was served on 12/3/2024 when 1/2 cup is required weekly at lunch for grades K-8 at Menta Academy Yuma. This was not a repeat finding from the previous cycle and therefore did not contribute toward fiscal action calculations.

Specifically, 1/8 cup and 3/8 cup of starchy was served during the week of review at Menta Academy Yuma and Crane Middle School, respectively, when 1/2 cup is required weekly at lunch for grades K-8. Additionally, 1 cup of red/orange vegetable was served during the week of review at **Educational Opportunity Center Charter** High School when 1 1/4 cup is required weekly for grades 9-12. This was not a repeat finding from the previous cycle and therefore did not contribute toward fiscal action calculations.

Specifically, 1/2 cup vegetables was served at Menta Academy Yuma when 3/4 cup (K-8) and 1 cup (9-12) is required daily at lunch. This was not a repeat finding from the previous cycle and therefore did not contribute toward fiscal action calculations.
