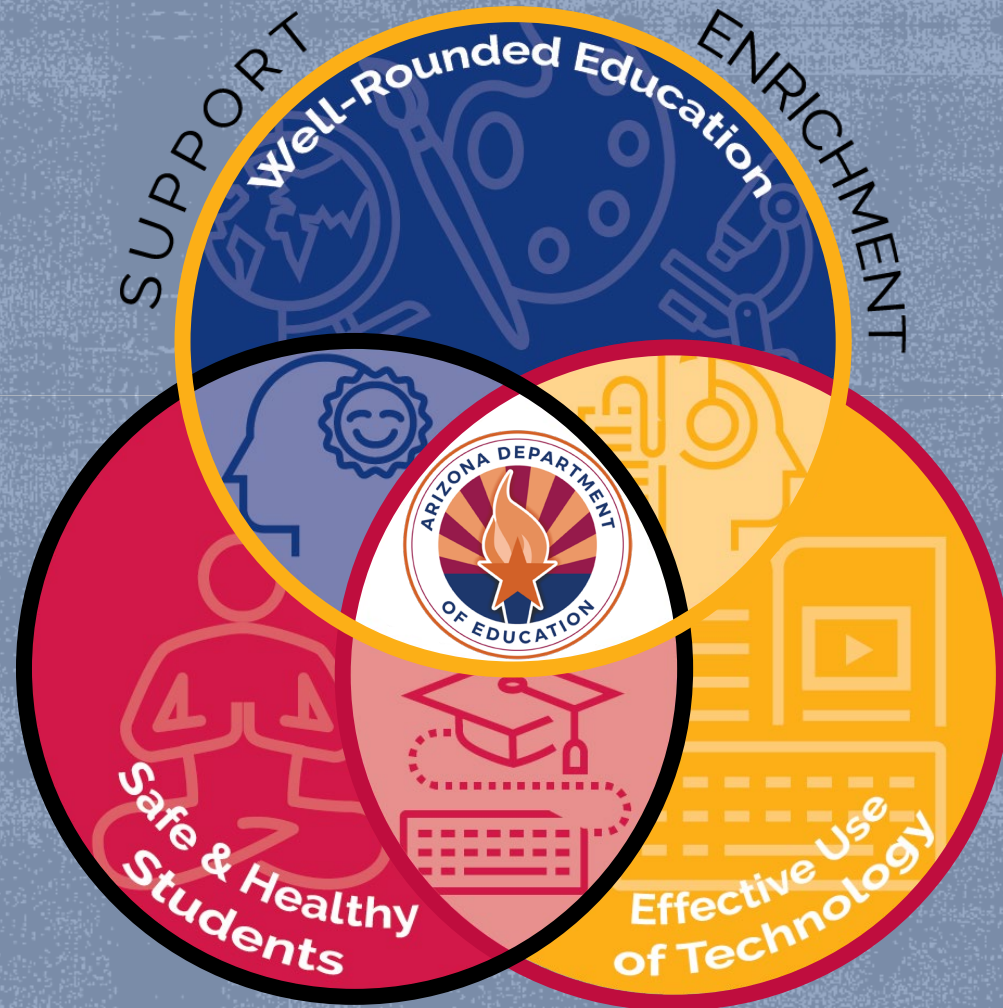

Title IV-A is **NOT** for:

Non-Allowable Activities



Remediation – Math & ELA tutoring

Reading/ Writing Supplies

Math Supplies

Student snacks

Class supplies – not related to a TIVA program

Items previously funded by state/local funds

Recruitment / Retention Stipends

Construction

Programs & Supports required by State law

Decorations, party supplies, furniture rental



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EDUCATION

ALLOWABLE ACTIVITIES

The expenditures are **NOT** required by other Federal, State, or Local Laws

The expenditures were **NOT** funded in previous years by non-Federal funds

The expenditures or activities **WOULD NOT** happen without the use of federal funds

LEAs **CAN** fund ELA and Math as part of a Well-Rounded Education if...

TRANSFERRING TITLE IV-A FUNDS



Under the ESEA, LEAs may transfer funds they receive by formula under certain programs to other programs to better address State and local needs.



The *Every Student Succeeds Act* amended the transferability authority by changing the programs from and to which an LEA may transfer funds and removing limits on the amount of funds that may be transferred.

ASSURANCE OF TRANSFERABILITY

I understand that the Student Support & Academic Enrichment Grant, or Title IV Part A is intended to:

- Provide all students with access to a well-rounded education
- Improve school conditions for student learning
- Improve the use of technology in order to improve the academic and digital literacy of all students (ESEA section 4101)



ASSURANCE OF TRANSFERABILITY

- LEA understands that transferred funds will no longer have the flexibility of Title IV-A funds but will take on the restriction of the grant the funds are transferred into.



ASSURANCE OF TRANSFERABILITY

- The LEA assures that timely and meaningful consultation with all eligible private schools operating within the LEAs boundaries were consulted prior to Title IV Part A funds being transferred. (ESEA section 5103(e)(2))



ASSURANCE OF TRANSFERABILITY

- LEA understands that they can leverage Title IV Part A funds across all schools regardless of school Title I status, and Title IV Part A funds have no carryover limit.



ASSURANCE OF TRANSFERABILITY

- The LEA assures that a need assessment was conducted which communicated the need to transfer funds and that a diverse representative of stakeholders will be consulted throughout the planning process



ASSURANCE OF TRANSFERABILITY

- **Narrative Question:** In the Narrative Box, please indicate why the LEA is choosing to transfer Title IV Part A funds. What specific need is the LEA addressing with this action?

BENEFITS OF NOT TRANSFERRING

- Sends a message to Congress that these funds do impact students
- More money is kept at the LEA due to funding following the student in Title I
- Carryover is impacted due to the Title I carryover restrictions
- District wide grant that can be used at non-Title I schools to support a student's civil right to a well-rounded education

Jan-March • CNA & IAP, Stakeholder Consultation starts

March-May • Pre-Planning Budget

May 1 • Substantial Approval Submission

Aug – July • Revisions & Monthly Reimbursements

Sept 30 • End of Performance Period, Completion Reports: Due Dec.


