Diploma Seals

Seal of Biliteracy

- Complete all English courses with a GPA of 2.0/4.0
- Demonstrate English Proficiency on an approved assessment
- Demonstrate an intermediate-mid proficiency for a second language on an approved assessment

Seal of Civics Literacy

- Pass the Arizona Civics Test for graduation
- Complete all social studies courses with a 3.0/4.0 GPA
- Complete 3 Civic Learning Activity
- Complete 30 Hours of Civic Engagement Activities (10 are required to be civics based)
- Written Reflection

Seal of Personal Finance

- Complete all social studies courses with a 3.0/4.0 GPA
- Complete an approved personal finance program or curriculum
- Complete and approved extra- or co-curricular program (minimum of 10 hours)
- Complete an approved college and/or career readiness plan





Seal of Arts Proficiency

Objectives

- Celebrate students who demonstrate elevated levels of proficiency in the Arizona Arts Education Standards
- Identify pathways of artistic literacy
- Prepare students for college and ٠ career readiness in the creative industries sector
- Promote increased access to well-٠ rounded, high-quality arts education

To qualify for the Arizona State Seal of Arts Proficiency, a student will complete:

- 1. All qualifying Arts and Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses with a GPA of 3.0 or better on a 4.0 scale, or the equivalent
- 2. Minimum credit requirements in one of the following ways:
 - 4 credits in one artistic discipline dance, music, theatre, visual arts, media arts - or
 - 3 credits in one artistic discipline and 1 credit in a qualifying creative industries CTE program or separate artistic discipline – or
 - 2 credits in one artistic discipline and 2 credits in a creative industries CTE program or separate artistic discipline
- 3. 80 hours of arts-related extracurricular activities
- 4. A student capstone project

A-F Rating and CCRI Connections

- ✓Students who earn a diploma seal count towards a school's <u>A-F Report Card</u>.
- Each seal counts as .5 a point (up to one point per student).
- Students can attain more than two seals but only two count towards school rating.
- Non-participation does not mean deduction of points.
- Points are awarded in the CCRI (College and Career) **Readiness Indicator**)
- The <u>CCRI</u> counts as 20% of a high school's letter grade and contains multiple indicators for which students can earn points.





Department of Education

- Designs and models an accountability system that is quantitative and measurable through committees
- Collects the self-reported data and calculates letter grades
- Holds all data for letter grades

State Board of Education

- Appoints members to the technical advisory committees that facilitates design of the
 - models
- Approves the models presented by ADE



FAFSA CHANGES FOR 2025/2026

FSA ID Creation

- Starting August 2025, when a person who has a SS# sets up their studentaid.gov account, the FSA ID will be instantly verified.
- Students & contributors, will be able to go directly to their FAFSA, grant consent, transfer their information from the IRS, & complete the form.

FAFSA Beta Testing

- Arizona was selected as a state to conducted FAFSA Beta testing this August.
- Beta-testing will begin August 11th-14th.

FAFSA scheduled to Open by Oct. 1^{st!}
