

Ungraded Elementary (UE) Reporting Guidance

Technical Assistance Manual

June 2025



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Introduction

As documented in the <u>Age Requirements & Validations for Funding</u> section of the School Finance Manual, Ungraded Elementary (UE) is an approved designation for a student when a grade cannot be determined (i.e., the child is not in kindergarten). This is intended for kindergarten-age students who have a Group B disability, have an IEP that outlines the necessity for full-time kindergarten, and are receiving services while being enrolled in a full-time program of 712 hours per year.

Criterion

A.R.S. §15-901(A)(3)(a)(i) and (14)

- Public education agencies (PEAs) can report a grade of UE for a student who meets the criterion, and this grade must document the necessity for a full-day instruction program on the student's IEP.
- 2. Ungraded group B children with disabilities must be at least five but under six years of age by September 1.
- 3. Group B disabilities include the following:
 - Autism (A)
 - Emotionally Disabled Private (ED-P)
 - Hearing Impairment (HI)
 - Multiple Disabilities (MD)
 - Multiple Disabilities Severe Sensory Impaired (MDSSI)
 - Moderate Intellectual Disability (MOID)
 - Orthopedic Impairment (OI)
 - Preschool Severe Delay (PSD)
 - Severe Intellectual Disability (SID)
 - Visual Impairment (VI)
- 4. These students must also be enrolled in an instructional program that meets for at least 712 hours for a 180-day school year.

Provided the abovementioned criterion is met, this grade classification does entitle the student to full-day Average Daily Membership (ADM) for state funding.

UE in Tuitioned Out or Vouchered Sites

If a PEA, private day school, or residential treatment center has students with disabilities that meet this criterion, the UE grade will need to be approved by ADE Exceptional Student Services.
