Keynote Speakers

Jessica Cox

Jessica Cox is a motivational speaker featured on TV shows like Ellen, CNN, National Geographic, Fox and Friends, and BBC News. Her speaking career spans 18 years, 28 countries, and audiences of up to 40,000 people. Companies like AT&T, NASA, the Smithsonian, State Farm, and Cisco have asked her for inspirational workshops, keynotes, and more.



Jessica was born without arms and uses her feet the way most people use their hands. Jessica grew up asking with frustration and anger, "Why me? Why do I have to be different?" She learned to see the blessings in her life and accept herself as a whole person. Now, Jessica flies airplanes, drives cars, is married, and otherwise lives a normal life.

Jessica is the author of *Disarm Your Limits*, an autobiographical self-help book that has sold more than 10,000 copies. She also writes a monthly article for Flying Magazine. In 2020, Jessica announced plans to build The Impossible Airplane, a custom 200 mph, 4 seat airplane she will use to circumnavigate the world. When she's not flying off into the sunset, Jessica continues to train in Taekwondo, where she's a Fourth Degree Black Belt.

Shawn Harper

Shawn Harper is a former NFL offensive lineman turned successful entrepreneur and nationally recognized motivational speaker. Once labeled "most likely to fail," he defied the odds—overcoming learning disabilities and a 1.62 GPA to play 7 years in the NFL with teams like the Rams and Colts.



Today, he's the CEO of a multi-million dollar security firm and author of the best-seller *The Winning Edge*. Known as the "Winologist," Shawn empowers corporations, students, and leaders to shift from success to winning through mindset transformation. His nonprofit, For The Next Gen, inspires youth nationwide to rise above obstacles and choose greatness.

Brandon K. Wright

Brandon K. Wright is an attorney in Illinois who concentrates his practice in K-12 special education law, serving as legal counsel to school districts and special education cooperatives throughout Illinois.



Brandon spends a significant amount of time providing professional development and continuing education opportunities across the country. He has trained administrators and teachers about managing legal issues involving students with disabilities and other school law concerns, having presented to educational professionals in 26 states (and counting). Brandon serves on the Executive Committee of the Illinois Council of School Attorneys and is a past Chair. He has previously taught as an adjunct faculty member at Southern Illinois University and Eastern Illinois.
