Indirect costs were incorrectly calculated. Specifically, the correct indirect cost rate was applied to an incorrect direct cost base. requirements that indirect costs be charged Specifically, Balsz Elementary District direct consistently across the SFA as required in 2 cost base was not supported by expenses reported in general ledger. \$243,886.53 must be returned to the nonprofit school food service account.
