1 Food quantities served at lunch during the review period did not meet minimum amounts required by the meal pattern. Specifically, 1/2 cup fruit was served on March 4, 5, & 6, 2025, when 1 cup is required daily at lunch for grades 9-12. This was deemed a systemic error and also occurred on March 10, 11, 12, 13, 24, 25, 26, 27, & 31, 2025. This was not a repeat finding from the previous cycle and therefore did not contribute toward fiscal action calculations.

This was not a repeat finding from the previous cycle and therefore did not contribute toward fiscal action calculations.

Specifically, during the review period, nonprogram adult meals were not priced in accordance with the requirements for revenue from nonprogram foods. The SFA did not use a method to determine adult meal price of \$4.50 per meal when the minimum requirement for School Year 2024-2025 is \$4.84 per meal.
