

The Outstanding Chapter Award is a chapter recognition program designed to encourage Family and Consumer Sciences' students to become leaders and promote FCCLA in their school, community, and state. This award provides an opportunity for chapters to receive recognition for success in and out of the classroom through self-evaluation and chapter success. This program is designed to keep the Arizona FCCLA membership strong and active.

Eligibility

- Chapters may submit one entry for this recognition award.
- Participation is open to any state and nationally affiliated FCCLA chapter.
- Activities for the Outstanding Chapter Award must be completed during the current membership year.
- Activities and all supporting material must be planned, prepared, and implemented by the members.

Recognition

Chapters completing the Outstanding Chapter Award will receive recognition at the State Leadership Conference.

- Bronze (1 activity from each section)
- Silver (2 activities from each section)
- Gold (3 activities from each section)

Deadline

All applications and supporting evidence must be submitted to the correct electronic application by February 16, 2025. Click here for the application.

Requirements

The Outstanding Chapter Award is a pick-and-choose model with the goal being for a chapter to complete activities from each section to showcase a vibrant and robust chapter. The total number of activities completed will determine the level of recognition, contingent on all supporting evidence being provided.

All chapters must meet the following minimum requirements:

- Affiliate through National FCCLA by November 1st
- Complete the Annual Chapter Submission Form by November 1st

Family:

Increase chapter membership by 20% from the previous year or have 100% of students enrolled in your program affiliated.

Chapters have the option of increasing their membership by 20% from the previous school year or having 100% of students enrolled in the program by affiliated FCCLA members. State staff will verify affiliation numbers based on the previous year's membership report and members currently affiliated in the FCCLA portal as of February 1st. A list of currently enrolled students must be provided if you choose to have 100% of students affiliated.

Nominate a Member of the Month three times.

Arizona FCCLA focuses on recruiting, retaining and recognizing members. Chapter advisers are asked to nominate a member of the month three times as they work directly with these individuals on a regular basis. To provide evidence, upload a PDF version of the confirmation email that you received. Click here to access the form.

Have chapter members participate in FCCLA@theTable.

FCCLA@theTable encourages youth to engage in the planning and preparing of healthy meals for their families as they develop strong family relationships. To provide evidence of chapter members participating in FCCLA@theTable, upload a PDF of photos of students cooking and eating dinner with their families.

Create a chapter budget.

Ensure a strong financial foundation for your chapter by creating a chapter budget. To provide evidence, upload a PDF version of the budget.

Speak out for FCCLA by promotion FCCLA at Open House, 8th grade orientation, Club Rush, etc.

Plan and participate in a recruitment activity at your school or within your school district. Show your potential members what you do, who you are, and encourage them to join FCCLA. To provide evidence, upload a PDF version of photos from the event.

Career:

Have an industry guest speaker present to the chapter.

Organize a demonstration, presentation, or industry field trip to learn about different FCS careers. To provide evidence, upload a PDF version of photos from the event.

Participate in a work-based learning activity.

A key component of any FCS Program is engaging is Work-Based Learning. Submit photo evidence of your chapter members participating in a work-based learning activity. (Catering, Fashion Show, Preschool Teaching, etc...)

Chapter members are registered to patriciate in STAR Events at the State Leadership Conference

To provide evidence of chapter members being registered, submit a PDF of the confirmation email of the chapter's SLC registration showing the STAR Event registration.

Participate in the FCCLA/Life Smarts Knowledge Bowl or FCCLA/Knowledge Matters Virtual Business Challenge.

The FCCLA/Life Smarts Knowledge Bowl is a national team competition that challenges students' knowledge in six content areas related to FCS. Chapters only need to participate in the Online TeamSmarts Quiz to qualify for completion of this activity for the Outstanding Chapter Award. Nominate an Administrator of the Year or Adviser of the Year.

Administrator of the Year: Arizona FCCLA values the hard work and dedication of administrators at the local schools. To provide evidence of a nomination, upload a PDF version of the confirmation email that you received. Click here to access the form.

Submit a published news article/report featuring your chapter.

Contact your local newspaper, television station, or radio station to promote chapter activities, achievements, or events. To provide evidence, submit a PDF of the published article or link to a audio or video recording.

Partner with another CTSO or organization on campus in an activity.

Engage in the community by partnering with another CTSO or other organization on campus to plan an activity, fundraiser, or community service project. Provide evidence by submitting a PDF of photos of the activity.

Host a We Help Two fundraising event in your chapter.

FCCLA chapters can raise funds for their chapter and impact their local community through the local sock donation program. Have at least 25% of affiliated chapter members complete the Power of One national program.

Have a member submit a State Officer Candidate application.

Arizona FCCLA would not function without the State Executive Council – the elected members of the organization. To provide evidence, provide the name(s) of the individual(s) who submitted an application. These names will be compared to the applications the State Staff has received. Please note, individuals who do not meet the qualifications listed in the State Officer Candidate Application will not count towards the Outstanding Chapter Award. Click here to learn more.

Have a Virtual Chapter Visit from the State Executive Council

Share leadership opportunities with your chapter members by inviting a member of the State Executive Council to give a presentation through a Virtual Chapter Visit. Present about FCCLA at a school board meeting.

Share the accomplishments of your chapter with your school board to spread awareness and garner support for FCCLA. Provide proof of attendance through a meeting agenda or photos.
