

## **READING CIRCLES**

Students read the text in roles, and then discuss the text based on assigned responsibilities.



# **STORY SEQUENCING**

Give students a jumbled story to reorder and explain their reasoning for the sequence.

Mock interview session to practice answering questions and build confidence before a real interview.



## SENTENCE STARTERS

Sentence starters introduce ideas and improve flow, making writing clearer and more meaningful.

Students write about daily life to boost language skills and writing fluency.




#### PROJECT-BASED LEARNING

Enhance students' quickthinking abilities and reaction times through a fun and interactive game.




# **CLASSROOM CHARADES**
