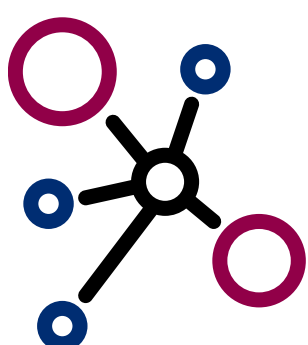


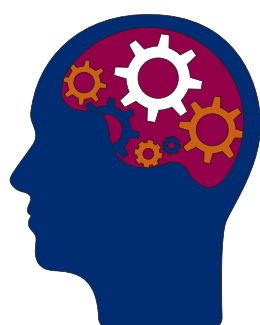

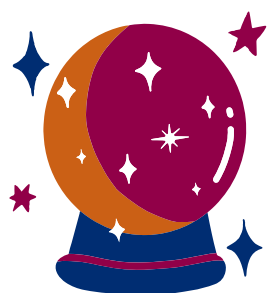
READING CIRCLES

Students read the text in roles, and then discuss the text based on assigned responsibilities.



STORY SEQUENCING

Give students a jumbled story to reorder and explain their reasoning for the sequence.



MOCK INTERVIEWS

Mock interview session to practice answering questions and build confidence before a real interview.



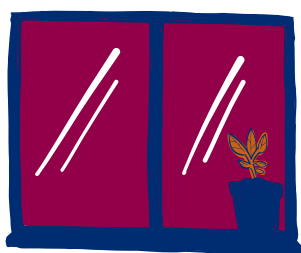
SENTENCE STARTERS

Sentence starters introduce ideas and improve flow, making writing clearer and more meaningful.



DIALOGUE JOURNALS

Students write about daily life to boost language skills and writing fluency.

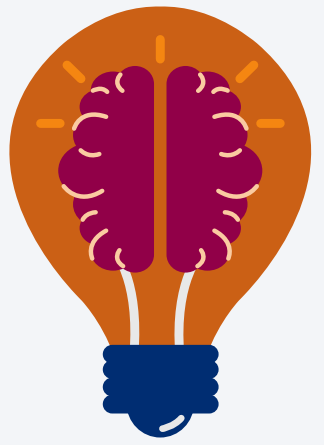


PROJECT-BASED LEARNING

Assign presentations or reports on relevant topics to build language and critical thinking skills.

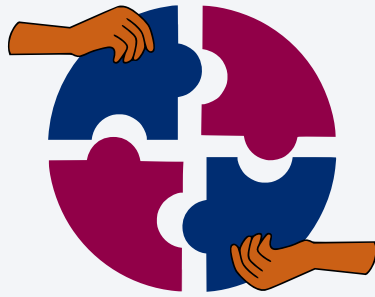
VISUAL AIDS

Enhance students' quick-thinking abilities and reaction times through a fun and interactive game.



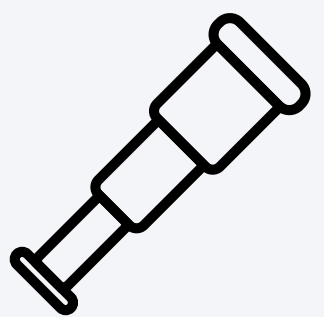
CLASSROOM CHARADES
