

Required Training Information

- You must create a <u>lawforkids.org</u> login account no later than 30 days after joining the SSP program.
- Failure to meet the annual training requirement will result in the LEA/charter being put on programmatic hold the following year and your LEA will not be able to draw down funds.
- If a grantee missed their annual required training, they must complete two trainings the next year, the missed training in addition to the annual required training for that year.
- For FY26, a returning district administrator must take the <u>District Administrator Advanced Course</u>, which is new for this year. A new District Administrator will take the Leadership 100 course.
- Site Administrator: This is typically the school principal or equivalent (ie: headmaster).
 - If the principal appoints a designee (assistant principal, dean of students, etc.) to oversee & implement the School Safety Program, both the principal and the designee must attend Leadership 100, thereafter the designee alone can attend the advanced training every year on behalf of the principal.
 - NOTE: If a principal has a designee attending training on their behalf, the principal must attend the Leadership 100 training once every grant cycle, as the training content will change substantially. The current grant cycle is SY23/24 to SY25/26. (Again, this applies to the principal even if their designee has been compliant in attending training on their behalf).
 - The designee must be an administrative on-site position such as an assistant principal, dean of students, or another administrative on-site position (for example, School Safety Coordinator, or similar). The Designee cannot be the counselor, social worker, teacher on special assignment, or front office personnel.
 - If there is turnover in either the site admin or the designee position, the new site admin or new designee must take Leadership 100 as they are new positions.
- If a grantee joins the SSP later in the school year, they are still required to attend training that school year if the appropriate training is still being offered. If the appropriate training is no longer being offered, the grantee will take the appropriate training the next school year.

- Administrators are welcome to attend New Officer Training or New CSW Training with their SRO, JPOs, or CSWs if seats are available.

How to Register

Step 1: Visit the Law for Kids website: https://lawforkids.org/programs/az-school-safety/training

- Step 2: Create an account or login to proceed
- Step 3: Click the training that will meet your annual training requirement (see diagram at the top of the page).

Step 4: Select the date you wish you attend and register to be sent a confirmation email

Step 5: Open your confirmation email and follow the instructions to complete the registration process

NOTE: Training attendance is directly linked to the name of the person who registered for the training. Thus, **each person must register separately to ensure they receive their own training link.** To receive full credit for attending the training, you must login using your own training link and your own device. If attending virtually, devices must have functional audio and video to receive credit for training.

Failure to meet your annual training requirement can result in your school district/charter being placed on programmatic hold next year.

Before the Training

Pre-work is required for some trainings, and it must be completed prior to attending the training. You will find information and links to any pre-work in your **confirmation email**.

Leadership 100

This is a one day training: Leadership 100 walks participants through the philosophy and requirements of the program and the key roles and responsibilities of the participants. This training sets a foundation for multi-disciplinary team-based approaches, data-based decision-making, as well as best practices for school safety. Participants will learn how the activities of officers, counselors, and social workers are connected to school safety and comprehensive efforts to drive your program. Finally, participants will locate helpful tools, supports, and resources.

During this training, participants will engage in purposeful activities, have opportunities for asking questions, and network with other school communities.

New Counselor & Social Worker (CSW) Training

This is a two-day training:

- Day 1 is Leadership 100
- Day 2 is specific to CSWs.

On Day 1, CSWs join Leadership 100 with other grantees (administrators, CSWs, and officers) to learn about the School Safety Program's philosophy, requirements, roles and responsibilities, and school safety-related topics. On Day 2, CSWs attend with their peers to clarify program requirements, share tools to meet those requirements, and spend time sharing resources and building collaborative connections with other CSWs.

Note: All counselors and social workers must register for this two-day training. Upon registering, participants will automatically be registered for both L100 & New CSW. Registering twice is not necessary.

*If you are a returning position and have not attended SSP training for the last two school years, you are required to take the new position training (New CSW) again, as the training content may have changed substantially.

New Officer Trainings (NOT)

This four-day in-person workshop covers community-oriented policing, the role of the school-based officers, and an introduction to Law Related Education (LRE) as an essential prevention tool.

- Day 1 begins with Leadership 100, where School Resource Officers and Juvenile Probation Officers attend training with other grantees (administrators, CSWs, and officers).
- Day 2 covers child and brain development, trauma-informed practices, and best practices for officers in schools.
- Days 3 and 4 take participants on a deep dive into Law Related Education, providing officers with classroom management techniques, space to share ideas and lesson plans, and knowledge of learning styles.
- Day 4 will also include working with students in special education per ARS 15-154, ARS 15-120.05, and ARS 15-761. Officers leave with resources and tools ready to teach in the classroom.

Please NOTE: All Officers will register for New Officer Training. It is ONE registration for all four days. Do not register separately for Leadership 100. Registering for New Officer Training will automatically register you for Leadership 100.

Advanced Law Related Education (LRE) Academy

See the Law for Kids website for a description of each Advanced Law Related Education Academy.

Who Attends? Continuing Officers – Upon completion of New Officer Training, officers are required to annually attend an Advanced LRE Academy through the Arizona Foundation for Legal Services and Education.

FAQ: Can a teacher attend the Advanced LRE Academy?

Yes, teachers may register and attend with the officer. A limited number of teacher scholarships are offered each year. Teachers create an account and register through the Law for Kids website. Note: A teacher may be waitlisted to ensure officers on the grant

SSO Training

*Please note that the Asynchronous Training has been eliminated and is no longer required to be completed.

Annual SSO Training shall introduce School Safety Officers (SSO) to the philosophy of the School Safety Program, ADE program personnel, 3 roles of a SSO and its alignment to the SRO position, Law Related Education (especially the 'best practices' and introduction to Universal LRE lessons), as well as how to work most effectively within the SSPT (school safety and prevention team) on each campus. Finally, officers will learn how to effectively interact with students with disabilities per ARS 15-154, 15-120.05, and 15-761.

Who Attends?

All SSP funded Officers working as an SSO. (SROs are not required to attend.)

All SSOs are required to attend a live, and interactive training—either in person (if located within Maricopa County) or virtually (if located outside Maricopa County). Must complete this training prior to accepting any shifts as an SSO at a school.

Supporting DAFN in Emergencies/Drills

Recent legislative updates to Arizona Revised Statute 15-341 (31) (a) states that emergency response plans must address how schools will communicate with and provide assistance to students with disabilities. To support school districts in implementing this mandate, the School Preparedness team will discuss Senate Bill 1315, share resources from current ADE guidance documents, and discuss best practices. Ultimately, this training will focus on implementation guidance to help schools ensure all students are adequately cared for in emergency preparedness and response initiatives.
