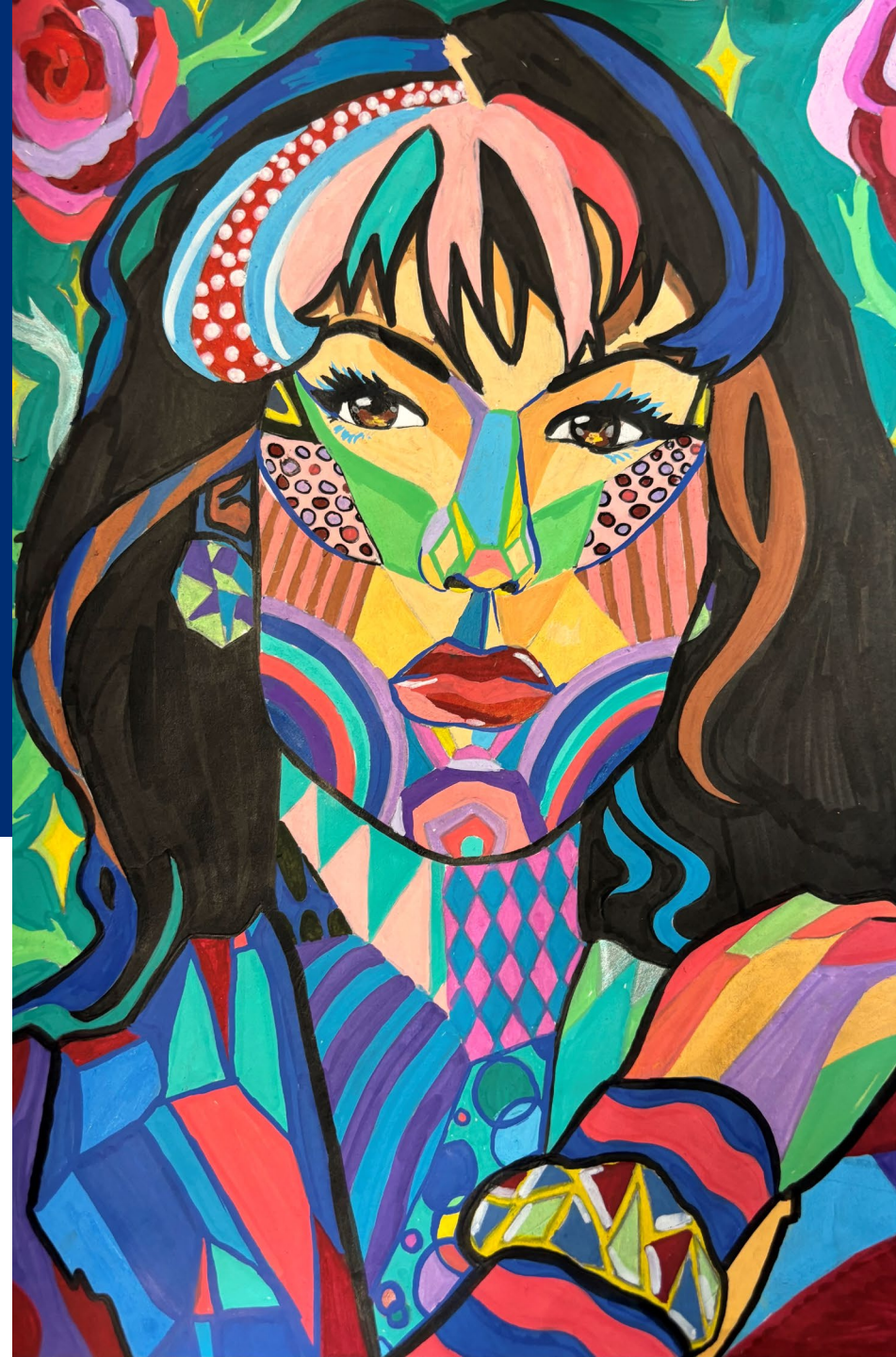


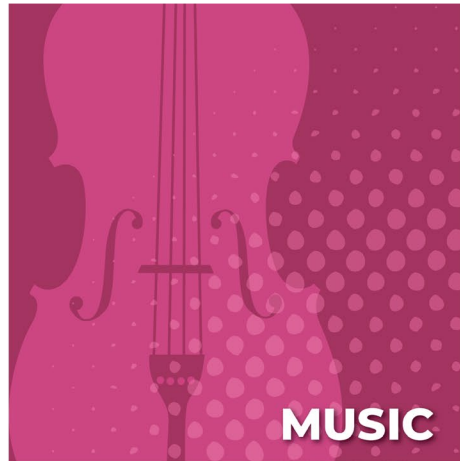

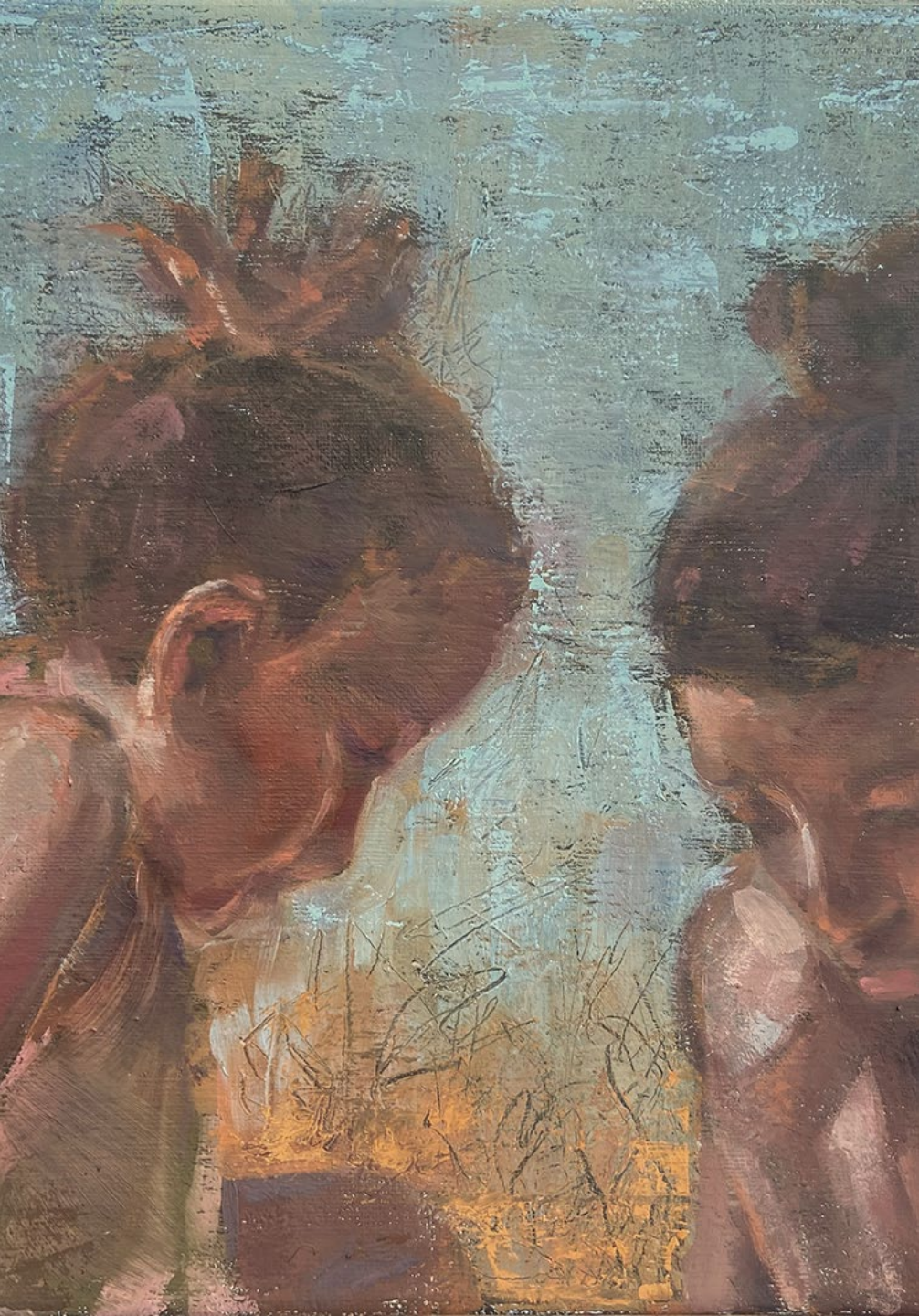

Students who participate in the arts are more likely to



Stay in School

- 5x lower dropout rate
- 4x more likely to win an award for school attendance



Succeed in School

- Nearly 100 points better on SAT
- 4x more likely to be recognized for academic achievement
- 3x more likely to be elected to class office



Succeed in Life

- Twice as likely to graduate college
- More likely to obtain gainful employment - higher pay, more responsibility, more satisfaction
- More likely to volunteer in their community and vote

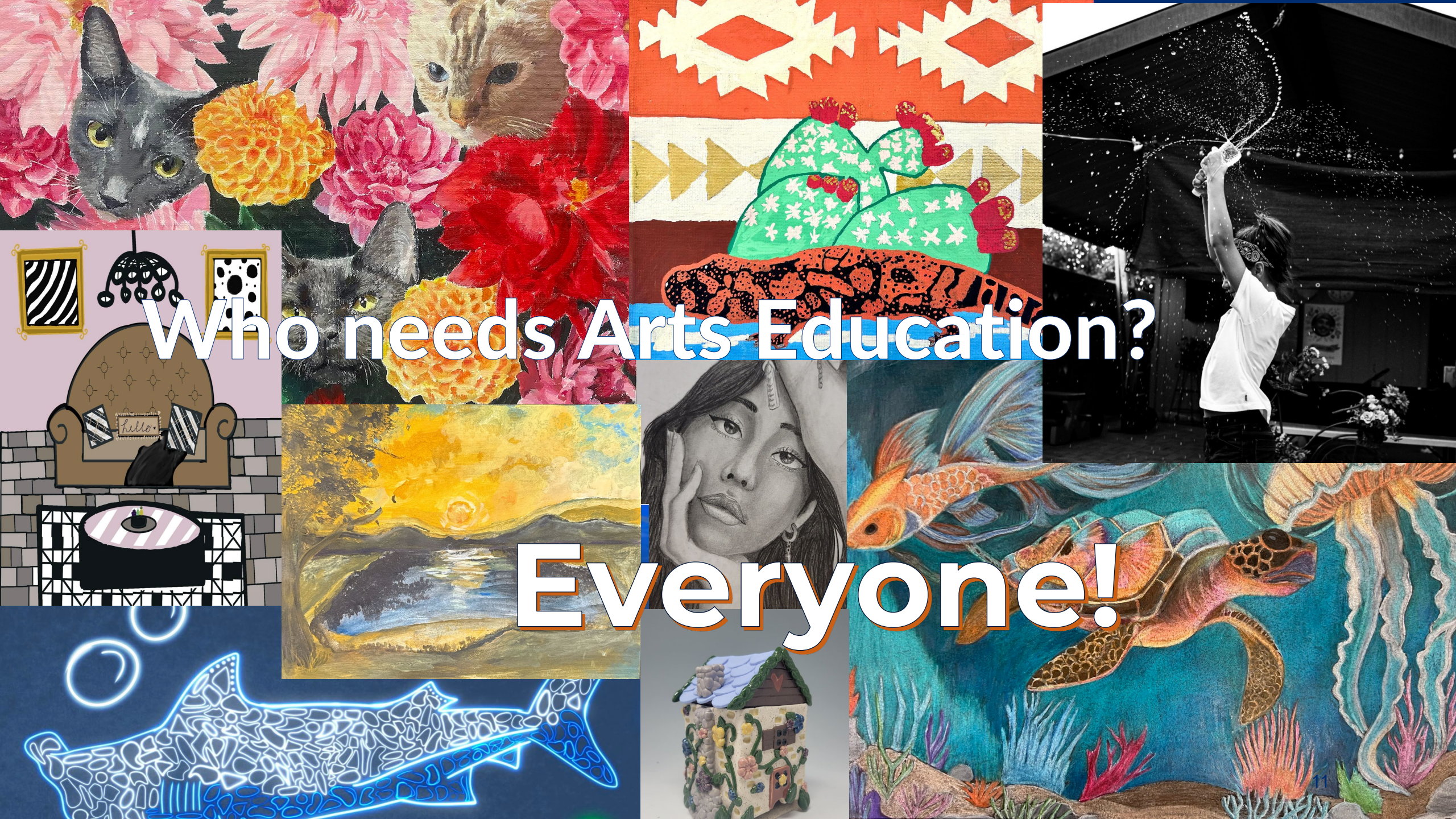

Creating (Cr)

Artists conceive and develop new artistic ideas and work.

Performing/Presenting/Producing (Pr)

Artists realize artistic ideas and work through interpretation and presentation

Responding (Re)

Artists understand and evaluate how the arts convey meaning

Connecting (Cn)

Artists relate artistic ideas and work with personal meaning and external content.

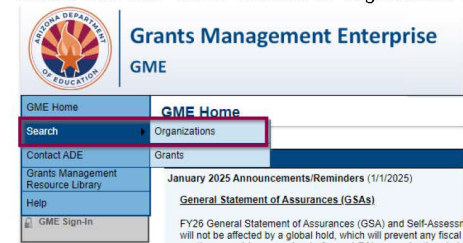

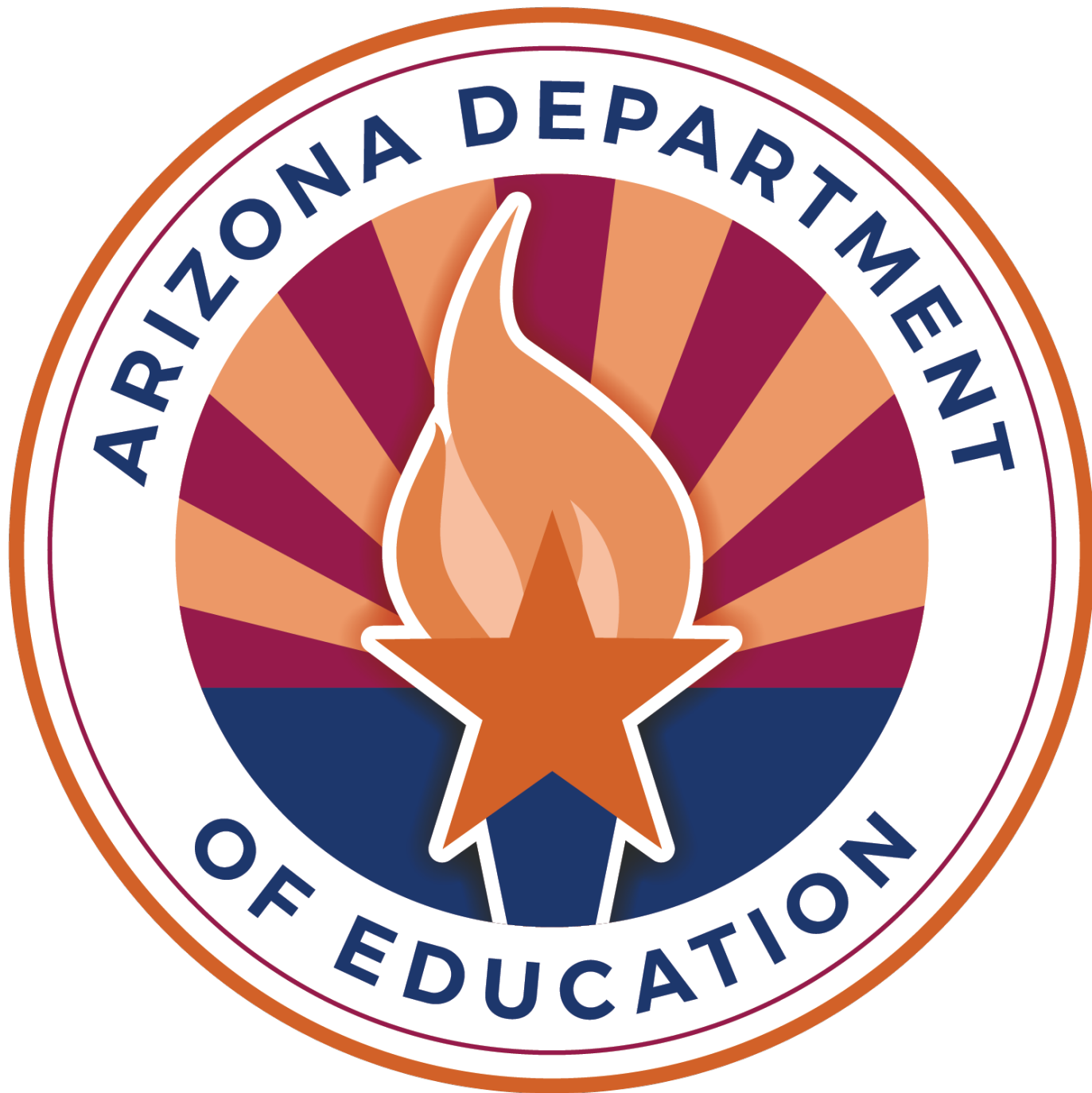
