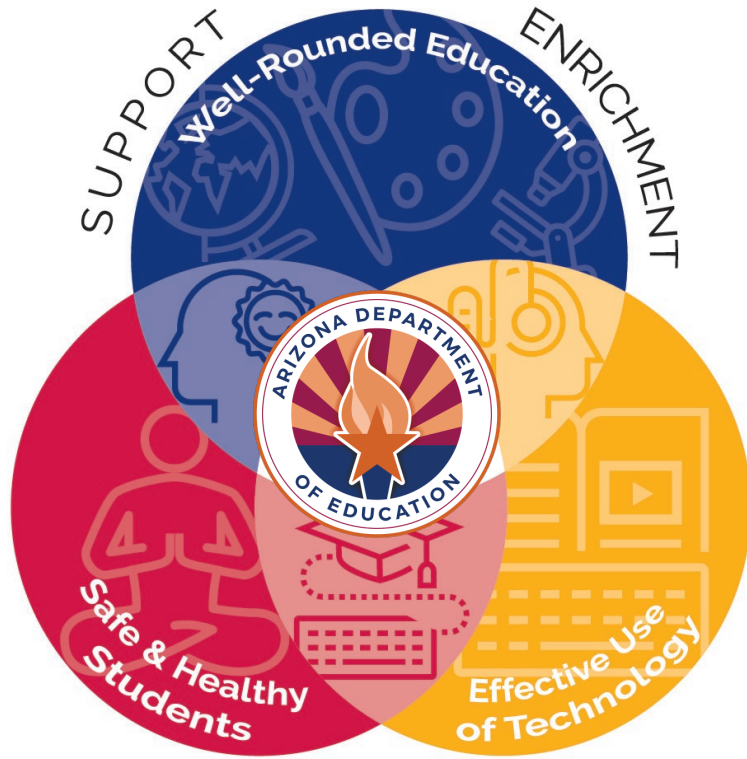




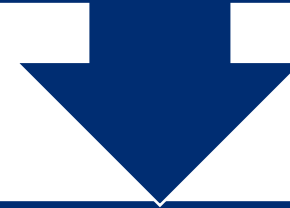

What:

The purpose of the **Title IV-A Student Support and Academic Enrichment** (SSAE) grant is to:



improve students' academic achievement by increasing the capacity of States, local educational agencies, schools, and local communities to provide all students with **access to a well-rounded education, improve school conditions for student learning, and improve the use of technology** in order to improve the academic achievement and digital literacy of all students. (ESSA Sec.4101)

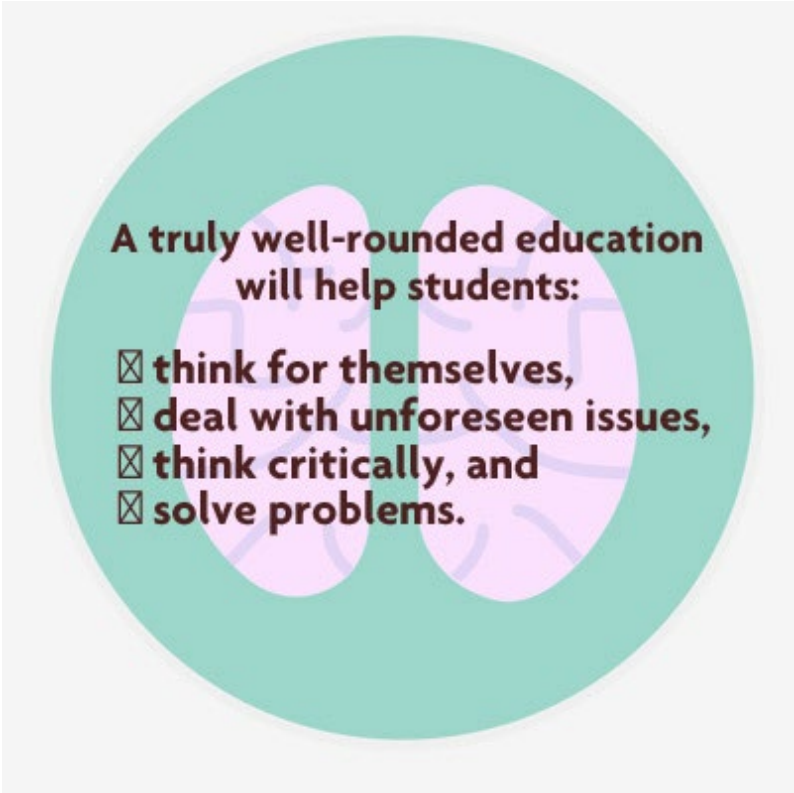
Why: Ensuring all students have access to a holistic well-rounded education is *central* to the shared work across programs in ESSA.

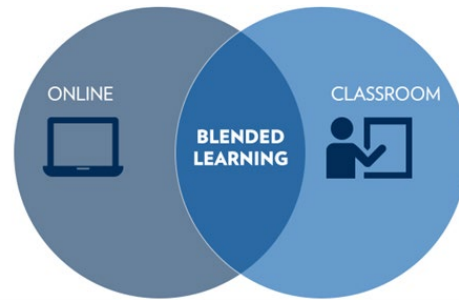
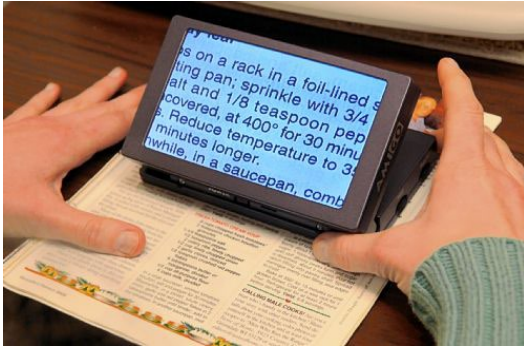

Title IV-A Special Rules

- Minimum allocation amount
- 20/20 Portion Rule
- 15% technology infrastructure cap

Minimum Allocation

All LEAs that meet eligibility requirements, regardless of size, that have a Title I Director approved application in the previous fiscal year, will receive a minimum of \$10,000 in TIV-A

Title IV-A Allocations

20/20 Special Rule

An LEA that receives **at least \$30,000 in SSAE program funds** must conduct a comprehensive needs assessment that includes, at a minimum, a focus on the three content areas. Based on the results of that assessment, the LEA must use:

- At least 20 percent of funds for activities to support **Well-Rounded Educational** opportunities (ESEA section 4107);
- At least 20 percent of funds for activities to support **Safe and Healthy Students** (ESEA section 4108); and
- A portion of funds for activities to support **Effective Use of Technology** (ESEA section 4109).

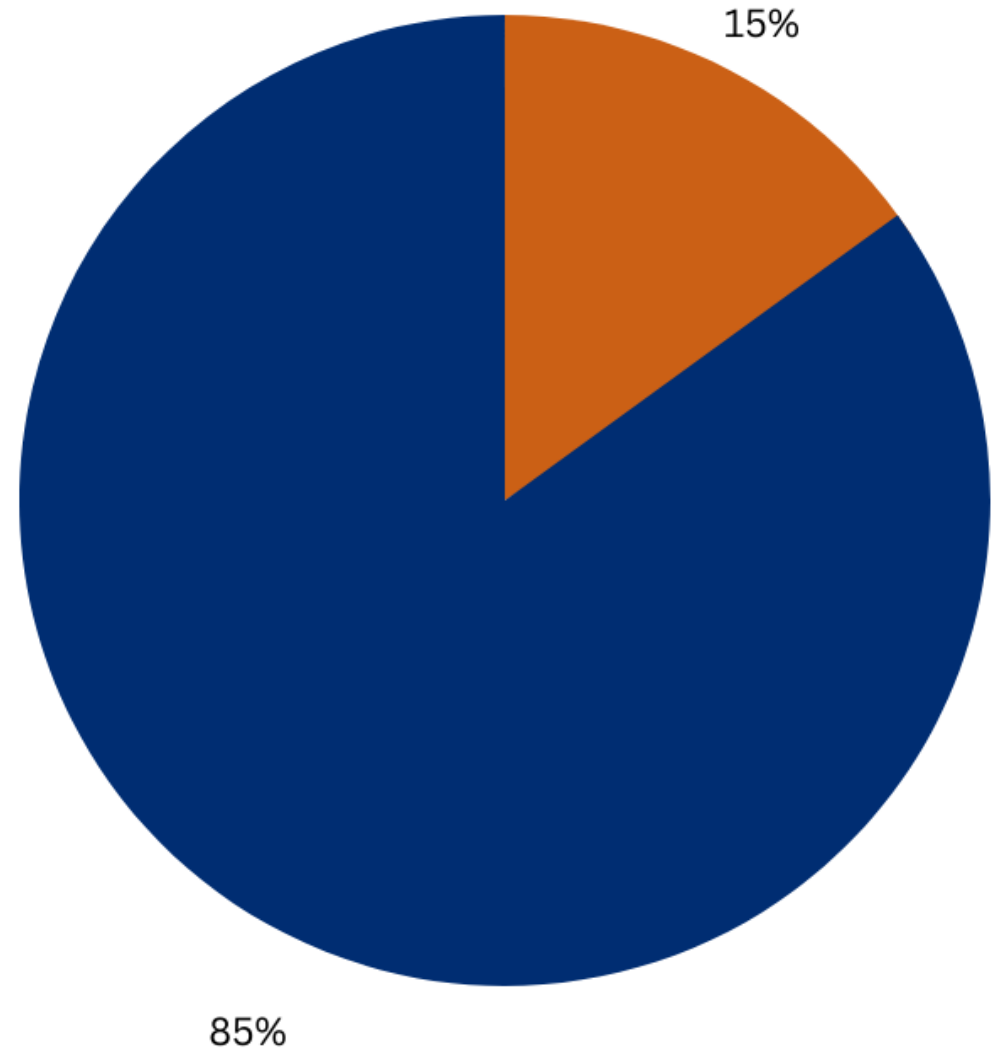
Within each of these areas, LEAs have broad flexibility to use the SSAE program funds for a variety of activities to improve student outcomes and address the opportunity gaps identified through the needs assessment.

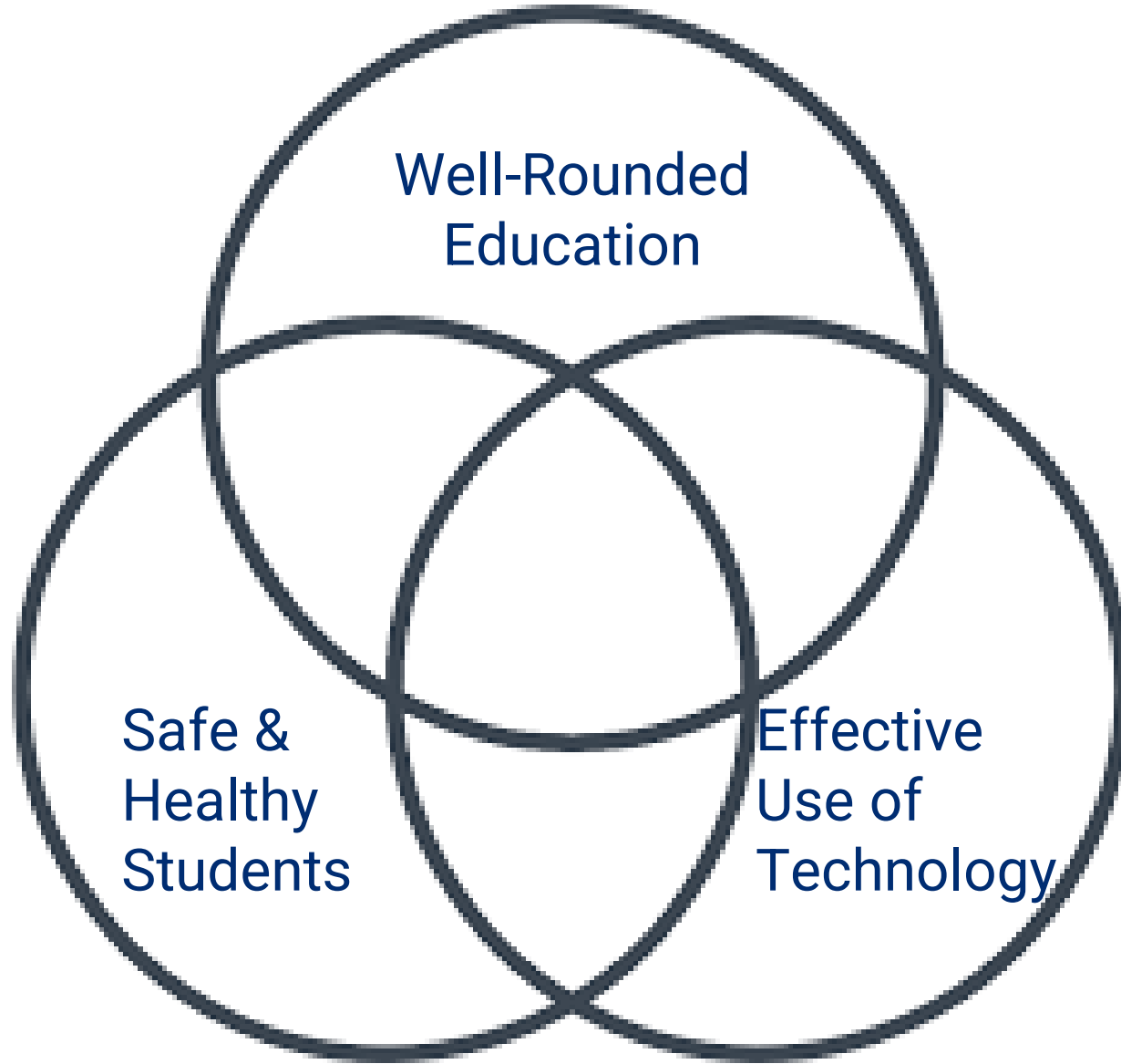

Arizona Title IV-A Spotlight

LEAs activated their Title IV-A funds to...

Create a Family & Community Engagement event structured around healthy eating habits

- ❖ Students learned how to **grow** healthy, sustainable foods in a newly created garden (Environmental Education, Science, Wellness)
- ❖ Students harvested gourds and worked with a local Indigenous **Artist** to paint native mythologies and symbols on the outside of their gourd (Arts Education, Foreign/Native Language)
- ❖ Students worked with their **Music Teacher** to transform gourds into musical instruments (Arts Education)
- ❖ **Family and Community** gathered for an evening event where the students shared how they grew the instruments in their garden, engaged the community in a student-led performance, and learned how to prepare traditional foods in healthy ways (Parent & Family Engagement, Community Partnerships, Health & Nutrition, Arts Education)

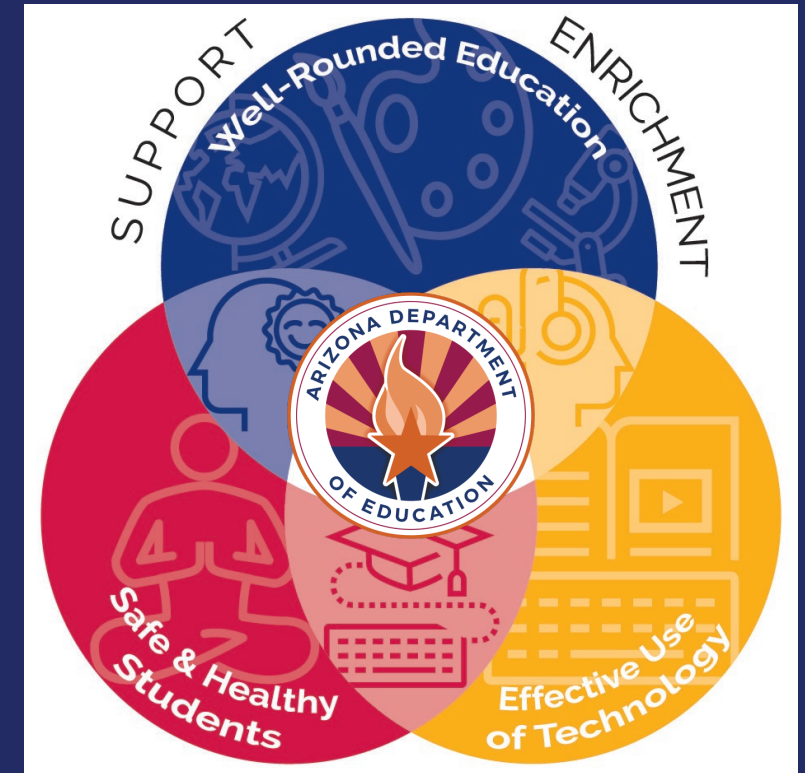

Title IV-A Safe and Healthy Students (SHS) Federal Funding Guide

The Title IV-A Safe & Healthy Students Program, provides support to schools and LEAs so that every student can experience a safe, healthy, and supportive learning environment, including focusing on students' physical health and safety. A safe, healthy, and supportive school environment is the product of a school's attention to fostering safety; promoting a supportive academic, disciplinary, and physical environment; and encouraging and maintaining respectful, trusting, and caring relationships throughout the school community, focusing on the fostering of favorable conditions, climate, and culture, including family and community engagement.

With any federal funding program LEAs must adhere to all federal funding regulations and State Education Agency (SEA) guidance, including [Supplement not Supplant](#) which is impacted by state and local laws. It is also important to note that all funding needs must be identified in the Local Education Agency's (LEA) Comprehensive Needs Assessment

The Title IV-A Safe and Healthy Students (SHS) Program supports:

- Promoting family and parent involvement in schools
- Implementing programs that support a healthy, active lifestyle (nutrition, health, and physical education)
- Promoting and implementing school health services (School Nursing)
- Providing counseling, psychological, and social services
- Physical environment
- Employee wellness
- Establishing community partnerships
- Establishing or improving drop-out prevention
- School safety/security programs - * Please note, all Title IV-A funded safety/security programs must adhere to the [Title IV-A School Security Request Memo](#)
