What is Adult Education?

Arizona Adult Education offers services to students 16 years of age* and older. Adult Education providers can be found across Arizona. They provide free (or low-cost) quality programs to:

- Improve literacy and academic skills for employment and economic self-sufficiency
- Earn an Arizona High School Equivalency (HSE) Diploma
- Participate in Integrated Education and Training (IET) programs to earn an industry-recognized credential and connect with employment and job training opportunities
- Become proficient in English language skills
- Transition to postsecondary education

Types of Classes

ABE



Adult Basic Education (ABE) classes to improve basic reading, writing, and mathematical skills to improve career opportunities.

HSE



Classes to prepare for earning an Arizona High School Equivalency (HSE) diploma through one of the three available pathways.

ESOL



English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) classes to improve English language skills in speaking, listening, reading, and writing.

IET



Programs available for earning an industry-recognized credential through Integrated Education and Training (IET).

Locations

 - Classes taught by certified teachers
