We strongly encourage wearing face masks.

- 1. Face coverings are no longer required on the School campus or at school-sponsored events.

Students must engage in frequent hand washing or sanitizing upon arrival, before and after lunch, before and after playground use, after using the bathroom and after sneezing and coughing. The School will encourage and reinforce handwashing with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, or as appropriate, using hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.

Upon learning of a positive COVID-19 test result in someone who has been in the School, the School will promptly seek guidance from local health officials to determine an appropriate course of action in light of the circumstances. At a minimum, the affected individual will be

quarantined from the School on-site environment (including on-site support services or in-person instruction) and other responsive actions will be taken, as directed in consultation with local health officials or in compliance with their guidance. If an outbreak* of COVID-19 occurs at the School, the School will notify the local health department using any required or suggested notification method.

All Aboard will provide for continuity of services as followed: Through our intervention and SEL programs offered to all students most at risk.

26. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' academic needs?*

For the school year 2021-2022, additional instructional personnel have been added to staffing to further our efforts for academic recovery in core curriculum areas. Interventions will be conducted during the instructional day, and all teachers will provide targeted interventions after school to meet the needs of students with significant learning gaps.

For 2021-2022 summer school will be offered to all students that are most at risk of not meeting the state standards.

At the end of the 2021-2022 school year, teachers, led by consultants, will meet to update curriculum maps that identify essential standards and when they will be taught and when proficiency will be met. This will be an ongoing process throughout the school year to facilitate learning.

27. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' social, emotional, and mental health needs?*

Counselors will be added to the summer school program to support all students. These specialists will meet with small groups of children to provide social-emotional learning lessons and to meet the emotional needs of all students.

AACS is implementing the Second Step Program, an evidence-based social and emotional learning program. The program centers on building harmonious relationships and creating an environment where all students feel valued and heard.

Counseling support will be provided as needed.

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28. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' other needs?*

This may include student health and food services.

AACS provided all students with a free breakfast and lunch during the 20-21 school year and will continue to do so during the 21-22 school year.

AACS will continue practices that follow local health department and CDC guidelines for contact tracing, isolation, and quarantine. If COVID-19 related issues require quarantining, all students will continue to have access to livestreaming, synchronous learning. Our school has a response plan and a designated isolation area for students or staff that develop signs and symptoms of COVID-19 illness at school. We are opening with increased safety precautions such as daily health screening protocols, physical distancing where possible and more frequent and improved cleaning and sanitation processes.

School leaders will work with teachers to identify staff's social, emotional, and mental health needs throughout the school year, and they will be addressed on an individual basis as needed.
