Students will be asked to wash their hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol upon arrival at school, before and after meals, and after sneezing, coughing, or blowing their noses. Students will be encouraged to wash their hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds or use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol after outdoor/physical activity and prior to leaving school at the end of the school day.

The school will conduct daily cleaning and disinfection of bathrooms, classrooms, and high touch areas using EPA approved virucide. Ventilation system filters are changed regularly with filters at the highest MERV rating indicated for the system.

The school consults the CDC, Arizona, and county health department protocols for reported cases, as needed. Cases reported to the school will be addressed on an individual basis in consultation with state and local health departments.
Quarantine may be advised by the state or local health department. If quarantined, students will be provided with technology and support to continue to participate in classwork and other services.

The school will ensure that students affected by quarantine, isolation, or any recommended or mandated school closures have access to technology to continue providing instruction, intervention, and other academic services remotely. The school will provide internet hotspots to families without reliable internet access

26. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' social, emotional, and mental health needs?*

Social and Emotional services will continue virtually during periods of quarantine/isolation or if a school closure is mandated. Additionally, the school will continue outreach to students and families to provide assistance to community resources and mental health services in the event of quarantine/isolation or school closure is mandated by the state or local health department

27. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' other needs?*

This may include student health and food services.

Access to food service will continue for students affected by quarantine, isolation, or a school closure. In these situations meal service will be provided through a pick-up system.

28. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for staff's social, emotional, and mental health needs?*

The school provides free access to the Employee Assistance Program to all employees and their family members . This free service includes free emotional and work-life counseling. In addition to counseling, the Employee Assistance Program also provides financial information/resources, legal support/resources, and health/benefit services to support employees during major life events. The school's health plan provides virtual access to medical professionals to eligible employees, including mental health professionals.

29. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for staff's other needs?*

Staff are provided with all needed technology and supplies to perform their job satisfactorily in-person and in the event of quarantine/isolation or a school closure. Employees may be assigned alternate duties in the event of a school closure to maintain their employment status to the greatest extent possible.
