If the situation calls for that, we will provide in-person learning. We have school counselors available at each site and a partnership with Pinal Hispanic Copper Queen, and Chiricahua Community Health Center.

We will provide synchronous and asynchronous learning, as well as provide Rti, tutoring, afterschool enrichment programs.

DUSD will continue to provide grab and go meals and will bus food out, if need be.

19. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' academic needs?*

Students will attend school in person. In the event of a quarantine due to a classroom closure, DUSD will continue to ensure student academic needs via synchronous and asynchronous learning via Google Classroom. All students will be afforded the opportunity to learn, receive make-up time to submit assignments during online instruction. Overall, the goal will be to not have any interruptions to student learning. Students may receive support via Tier 1 instruction, tutoring, RTi, pull out, enrichment, interventions, homework club, and MTSS.

20. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' social, emotional, and mental health needs?*

We have counselors at every site to provide individual counseling, SEL lessons to small group and whole group, as needed. We have partnered with outside behavioral health agency, which is located at every campus. Referrals are provided, as needed. We also have a behavioral specialist available to assess behavior needs district wide.
