The District provides in-person learning for students and families in K-12th grade. The District will also provide virtual learning for eligible students and families requesting this form of education. Virtual learning will be provided through the District's online school. Eligible students needing specific services as part of their education will be provided these services in-person or virtually.

28. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' academic needs?*

Students will be provided access to all courses needed to achieve educational goals. After School programs will be provided to help students with additional help to address loss of opportunity to learn due to the pandemic. Online courses will be offered 9th-12th for students who are credit deficient. The District has purchased 24-hour 365 day online homework help through the PAPER software. The software is designed to provide additional academic support for students.

29. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' social, emotional, and mental health needs?*

The District has hired counselors and social workers at all district schools. A SEL Specialist position was created at the District level. This individual will coordinate with school personnel to implement a SEL curriculum throughout the District. The District is implementing an SEL curriculum for all students. Staff have received professional development on the SEL curriculum.

30. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' other needs?*

This may include student health and food services.

The District will not continue free meals for all students during the 2023-2024 school year but comply with NSLP guidelines.

31. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for staff's social, emotional, and mental health needs?*

The District has a District Wellness Committee, established in 2015, which is committed to the physical and mental health wellness of staff. The committee meets throughout the school year to address a wide range of issues. Special emphasis will be placed this year on the social, emotional and mental health needs of staff. Resources, at the local, state and national level, will be shared with staff members throughout the year. In addition, information on resources to help in these areas will be shared through the District's healthcare benefits plan. Ongoing professional development to staff on social and emotional needs.

The District sought input via the provision of surveys to students, staff and community to collect input regarding the original Pandemic Response Plan. A District level committee developed this plan (Summer 2020) and the Governing Board approved the plan. Modifications to the plan were made throughout the year based on evolving federal and state guidance. The revised plan will be posted and opened for designated comment periods, in which students, staff and families have the opportunity to provide continued feedback. This feedback will be incorporated into future revisions of the plan which will be presented to the Governing Board, at a public meeting, for approval. The same process will be utilized for subsequent changes to the plan.
