Milestones provides only On-Campus Instruction for the 2023-2024 School Year. Packet pick-up is available for students that quarantine or isolate.

26. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' academic needs?*

Milestones provided free summer school in June 2021, June 2022 and June 2023.

Milestones started utilizing iReady, an online academic program for reading and math, in August 2020. The program assesses students at the beginning/middle and end of the school year to determine individual academic placement and areas that need academic support. Students are placed on an individual path to strengthen areas of need. Teachers and Administration can use this data to differentiate instruction within the classroom.

Milestones also utilizes Dibels assessments to progress monitor student's reading fluency and comprehension needs.

Milestones has a Special Education Department that frequently monitors student's progress and consults with teachers to offer academic support and strategies for Special Education students as well as students who need intervention.

Administration and Teachers have implemented additional time for small group intervention and direct instruction for all students. Milestones has purchased Studies Weekly and Junior Scholastic as curriculum for Social Studies for all grades.

Milestones teachers have afterschool programs that allow for additional academic support. These include a Math and, Reading and Science Club.

Faculty and staff trained through services provided by the Crisis

Response Network, Love & Logic and QPR Institute.

Social Emotional Curriculum purchased and implemented in K-8th grades.

K-6th Grades - Studies Weekly Well-Being Program is CASEL-Aligned,

Milestones has been able to incorporate additional afterschool, sports programs for our 4th – 8th grade students to participate and increase social skills. Students play against other area charter schools.
