#### 25. How will the LEA ensure Continuity of Services?\*

Briefly describe an overview of the continuity of services and in the following questions you will provide more detailed information.

SJUSD reopened school to in-person instruction during the 2020-2021 school year and has maintained that status moving forward. SJUSD will keep schools open for regular in-person instruction while implementing the use of adopted and recommended sanitizing procedures and social distancing guidelines in addition to other CDC recommended health and safety guidelines. PPE may be used, but according to Arizona State Legislative mandates, they may not be required. In-person instruction will be available for the same number of days per week and open the same hours offered during the prior school year before the COVID-19 closures or mitigation strategies took effect. ESSER funds are being used to pay retention stipends for teachers and staff to help ensure the return of school employees to assist in the continuity of services for the return to school and in-person instruction. SJUSD does have a dedicated Mental Health Counselor, who primarily services students with IEPs and 504s, but is also available to help support all students with SEL needs. Teachers also are receiving professional development and classroom support materials to help provide awareness and support for Social Emotional Learning.

#### 26. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' academic needs?\*

In anticipation of addressing learning loss resulting from Covid-19, SJUSD is using ESSER funds for the retention of teachers and staff for continuity of services, to add additional teachers, paraprofessionals to help lower some class sizes to provide more targeted instruction for at risk students and to provide additional intervention opportunities to support at risk students of all subgroups. Additional Summer School teachers have been hired and the Summer school opportunities have been expanded to support a larger segment of the population to help bridge the learning gap and summer slide. ESSER funds are being used to purchase additional Chromebooks and software to provide greater equitable opportunities for all students to access to the appropriate technology that is used for instructional and intervention opportunities.

SJUSD does have a dedicated Mental Health Counselor, who primarily services students with IEPs and 504s, but is also available to help support students with SEL needs.

SJUSD implemented a return to in-person instruction and health and safety mitigation plan in September of 2021 for the 2021-2202 school year. This plan has been updated with additional required information for the adoption and implementation of the 2022-2023 school year and will be reviewed and updated every 6 months as required by ADE and USEd. SJUSD held meetings with the Superintendent in October 2022 that were advertised on SJUSD's Facebook page for any parent or community member who wanted to give feedback on any of the District's policies and to address any of their concerns. No comments were received, but revisions were made based on current national and state guidelines and in accordance with the needs and standards for SJUSD students.
