The Sunnyside USD face mask policy was modified effective 3/21/22 by the Sunnyside Governing Board to make mask wearing optional for students and staff. We continue to make masks available at all sites and the District Office for anyone who would like to wear one.

The district continues to reinforce the policy regarding hand washing and respiratory etiquette. SUSD encourages proper hand hygiene, such as reminding students and all staff to wash hands after using the restroom, before meals, etc.

Supplies such as tissues, hand soap, and disinfectant wipes will be provided to support healthy hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette throughout the day.

Hand sanitizer and/or stations will be available in all schools and district offices.

15. Please describe the LEA's Governing Board policy on cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation.*

The district invested in a multimillion dollar HVAC upgrade to improve air filtration and ventilation. The following air quality system improvements were made to all school facilities:

Air Quality: After extensive research into which air purification solution would be most effective for our district, we found that the Needlepoint Bi-Polar Ionization (NBPI) system consistently ranked as a leading technology for pathogen mitigation.

The NBPI system is an advanced air cleaning process which can be incorporated into a building's existing HVAC system. The air purification system is capable of destroying 84% of coronaviruses within 10 minutes and 99.4% within 30 minutes. The NBPI system has been used with great success in healthcare settings and other highly-sterile environments where effective removal of airborne viral particles is critical.

All SUSD A/C units are now emitting both negative and positive ions into the air for a healthy environment.

The district has suspended contact tracing at this time. Parents are responsible for determining their child's health status before arriving at school. Parents are responsible for keeping their child at home should they present with any symptoms of illness.

SUSD collaborates with the Pima County Health Department to host vaccination events in the district. We will continue to offer our facilities as needed. The district shares information from the PCHD regarding vaccination opportunities in the community.

Nursing staff is adequately trained on COVID precautions and safety measures (use of PPE) for children with disabilities and has a safety plan in place for all special classrooms, including those students that are medically fragile. SUSD has actively engaged with State and local health officials and remains committed to continuing to offer our facilities and resources when needed.

26. How will the LEA ensure Continuity of Services?*

Briefly describe an overview of the continuity of services and in the following questions you will provide more detailed information.

SUSD has continued with in-person instruction for the 2023-24 school year. In-person learning will continue to be the default learning model for all students. Students excluded from school due to COVID-19 will have access to their assignments through their student assigned mobile learning device and hot spots, if needed. The district administration, through approval of the Governing Board, will ensure continuity of services through appropriate budget prioritization, resource management, ESSER fund utilization and other proactive measures that meet our students and staff academic, emotional and mental health needs.

27. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' academic needs?*

SUSD continues to make significant investments in technological resources that facilitate remote learning if needed. All students are provided with an iPad/Chromebook to help maintain student academic engagement. The district also offers Weekend Academy for high school students deficient in credits and offers afterschool programs at school sites with 21st Century programs to help provide additional learning opportunities. We will offer high school summer school and Summer Learning Camps at various school sites to support students K-8.

28. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' social, emotional, and mental health needs?*

SUSD has increased resources to support students' social, emotional and mental health needs. We have added additional Counselors, Social Workers and have partnered with community agencies to provide additional resources to students and families.

Additional support is provided through partnerships with Higher Ground and Liberty Partnership Kino Neighborhoods Council (LPKNC).

29. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for students' other needs?*

This may include student health and food services.

SUSD has made significant investments in health by providing a nurse/health aide at every school site. Our Food Service Department continues to provide breakfast and snacks to our extended day and summer school programs. They will also provide free meals at designated sites during the summer.

30. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services for staff's social, emotional, and mental health needs?*

The district has enhanced the Employee Wellness program through the hiring of a Wellness Coordinator and overall expansion of the Employee Assistance Program (EAP) and resources. An Employee Wellness Committee provides staff input on the types of services and resources they would like to see made available to all employees. The program continues to flourish and has provided employees with additional health support services, access to emotional and social support services and wellness incentives, and the district has seen an overall increase in staff engagement.

The district makes COVID test kits available to employees upon request.

The district utilizes different data sources to obtain feedback and input from students, staff, parents and the community. Data sources include: surveys, input from parent groups and events such as "cafecitos", or coffee with the Principal. Student Advisory meets monthly with the Superintendent and provides important feedback as well. The Wellness Committee and Interest Based Bargaining (IBB) committee also help provide important input. This data is reviewed during Director's Meetings and recommendations are made to the Board.
