If students are required to quarantine, we will give them the option of online learning or work packets for the duration of the quarantine. The student would have access to and communication with their teacher for assistance.

WES is working to implement an evidence based prevention and life skills training program. The program will include personal self-management skills that will help students help develop the skills to enhance self- esteem, develop problem-solving abilities, reduce stress and anxiety, and manage anger for better mental health. The program will also include lessons to helps students to develop general social skills and drug resistance skills.

Food service will continue to offer meals free of charge for all students. Clothes Closet and Supply Closet are open to those in need. We held a vaccine clinic for the students, staff, and community members.
