3:18 – Introductions (Nathan Johnston)

- Members live & online (Zoom)
- RTAC Mission/Purpose

3:30 - Old Business

- A-F Grade Update (Becky)
 - Was passed now have a state seal of proficiency
 - O Currently looking to see if Arts Ed can be included in the state's A-F letter grades
 - CTE counts for state letter grade, but Arts Ed does not
 - CCRI points 20% of a school's points (Blue points vs. Red points)
 - Looking to give Arts Ed equal points compared to CTE assessment (1.25 red points)
 - Students are "worth the most points" when they score red *and* blue points
 - Does CTE count for dual enrollment? Answer: Becky doesn't know but will find out
 - Becky laid out CTE Sequence vs. State Seal of FA Proficiency (FA requirements are more rigorous!)
 - O Future asks:
 - Add a well-rounded education slice (10%?) to the "pie" à other states are doing this; not a new idea
 - Instructional minutes per week of any 2 of the 5 accepted arts programs: Music, Visual arts, Media arts, Dance, Theatre
 - Question from student: If the well-rounded slice was added, would the schools give the students the resources they needed to participate in one of those disciplines? Answer: Yes, the schools would be responsible to provide resources.
- ESSA AZ Plan Updated (ADE)
 - O ADE currently updating the plan that gets submitted to federal education department
 - The Arts comes up several times in the current plan, and includes arts integration
 - Question: What parts of the Arts are supposed to be integrated into other learning? Answer: The goal is to integrate the Arts Standards in all other areas à math, social studies, ELA, etc.
 - Dustin Loehr will update RTAC as any new updates come up

3:48 - New Business

- Legislation Updates verbiage shift
 - O Changing CTE to "Practical Arts" (Doesn't really affect the Arts Ed folks)
 - O Rep. Udall (chair of ed committee) is creating graduation requirements. Board of Regents have admission requirements for college/university, so graduation requirements would make a lot of sense.
 - Deadline for input is Friday. Not likely to be approved à has too many "consequences". (crosses the line of what State Board should be doing…)

- ADE is remaining neutral
- Question from student: When would it go into effect if it *did* pass? Answer: It wouldn't be right away, but the chance of it passing is super slim.
- Data Dashboard (Elisa AZ Commission on the Arts)
 - o Project been in effect for 10 years à access vs. participation
 - Most recent data has come from ADE
 - o Check out slides from meeting for specific data
 - O Break down the data: school configuration, school type, locale, free/reduced lunch, majority racial make-up
 - O Video available on azarts.gov that explains how the dash board is used (~5 min long)
 - Impact of policy presented by Dustin
 - ALL K-8 grade students are to demonstrate competency as defined by State Board of Ed ... in the required areas of music **and** visual arts
 - See slides for specific data
 - Need sequential access in order to meet requirements
 - Question: Does this leave the students "stuck" for graduation requirements? Answer: No one is monitoring competency in K-8.
 - Question: How do we "fit in" arts ed when there are so many requirements (in school improvement)? Answer: Arts Ed is actually listed on the list of accepted interventions to help schools that are in school improvement. Dustin will send the questioner the info. J
 - State by State comparison
 - Conversation growing nationally
 - Current states in project are AZ, OH, CA, WI, NC, MN, NJ, TN à AZ falls in the middle of the pack as far as access to the Arts
 - part of problem is that reporting is self-reporting (not required), so accuracy is maybe not the best
- Creative Schools Award (Becky, Lynn, Haley)
 - o purpose: Recognize schools providing excellent arts ed across the state.
 - o goals: increase access and participation; increase number using Dash Board\
 - o details:
 - K-8 award
 - 9-12 award
 - organize into 6 different regions (based on counties) to allow rural schools to be recognized
 - 1st Round: criteria found in Arts Education Dashboard Data
 - 2nd round: phone calls to the top schools to ask clarifying questions
 - Awards can be presented at the Youth Arts Month celebration at ADE each year (this gives committee until late Feb to determine winner)
- ADE Updates
 - Seal Selection
 - Dustin presented picture of the Seal
 - Hot off the press: UofA's Fred Fox School of Music will give preferential placement to students with the FA Seal, and will offer a \$1000 renewing scholarship available with it.
 - Question: Where is the cost of mailing the seals coming from? Answer: ADE, specifically Title IV-A.
 - Question: Will there be a chord/sash that goes with the graduation gown? Answer: It will be up to each district.
 - Question: What size seal do we want for the diploma? Answer: 2 inch standard seal is fine.
 - Student Gallery Naming
 - March 6, 2020 is the unveiling of the gallery

- Haley read 4 nominations for advocate recognition for the namesake of the gallery
 - o Attendees called upon to vote
 - C. Rusty Foley 13 votes
 - Suann Spahr 3 votes
 - Andre Licardi 5 votes
 - Robyn Harris 1 vote\
 - Motion made by Dr. Linda Brett to accept the nomination of Rusty Foley. Seconded by Kelliann Bonnell. Motion approved.
 - The Supt. will be making a proclamation at the unveiling regarding a new AZ State Holiday (same proclamation power as Governor)
- Arts Advocacy Efforts (AZ Citizens for the Arts)
 - Convened a conference call with 30 people from arts organizations around the state to see what Phase II would look like. Short version: Another staff member taking the report out to the community and looking for connections to make that could move the Arts Ed needle.
 - Getting data and story in front of legislators.
 - Similar path for Arts Ed. (advocating for more \$ for Arts Ed)
 - Could lead to some independent case studies.
 - Looking for a new staff member to lead the charge on this.
 - Question: What is RTAC's potential role? Could we team up with Citizens for the Arts? Answer: Nathan will reach out to see what RTAC could be doing to double our efforts/opportunities.
