

Do you or your child need to get your COVID-19 vaccine?

COVID-19 vaccines are FREE, safe, and effective at preventing serious illness, and hospitalization related to COVID-19.

- The COVID-19 pandemic has greatly impacted the disability community. Several studies
 have found that people with an intellectual or developmental disability are at least twice as
 likely to contract COVID-19 and experience severe complications, due to their greater use of
 public and shared spaces, where transmission of the virus is higher.
- In the clinical trials of the Pfizer vaccine for children ages 12-15, no child who received the vaccine got sick with COVID-19, suggesting the vaccine is highly effective at preventing COVID-19.
- As of June 2022, 70.9% of children ages 5 -11 nationwide have fully vaccinated against COVID-19.
- COVID-19 Vaccines help protect children ages 5 years and older, from COVID-19 infection, especially protecting them from severe disease, hospitalization, or death.

The Pfizer-BioNTech Vaccine is approved for children ages 5 years or older and now can receive a Pfizer-BioNTech booster shot five months after their primary vaccination

Where to find COVID-19 vaccines

Contact your primary care provider (PCP)'s office

Hundreds of pediatricians statewide are offering pediatric Pfizer-BioNTech vaccines. Contact your child's provider to see if their clinic is one of them.

Vaccine Navigators

Continued support of vaccine navigation through the COVID-19 Hotline with English and Spanish speakers is available 7 days a week from 8 am - 5 pm. Call them today at **1-844-542-8201**.

Visit your local pharmacy

Be sure to call ahead to confirm that your vaccine brand of choice is available. While most pharmacies administer the vaccine on a walk-in basis, some can schedule an appointment to reduce wait time.















Transportation Options
